

tinuing thence generally south-westwards along the middle of Blackburn Road to a point opposite to the middle of Aspen Lane and continuing thence south-westwards along the middle of Aspen Lane (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said parish of Oswaldtwistle from the said parish of Saint Oswald, Knuzden), to a point 50 yards or thereabouts south-west of the Infant School opposite to the middle of the south-eastern end of the track or footpath leading from Aspen Lane to the track or footpath leading from Tower Street to Stanhill Road and continuing north-westwards along the middle of the first-mentioned track or footpath for a distance of 21 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the footpath leading from Tower Street to Stanhill Road and continuing thence north-westwards in a straight line for a distance of 400 yards or thereabouts to the south-eastern end of the wall or fence which divides close numbered 1 from close numbered 2 on the map annexed hereto and continuing thence north-westwards along the wall or fence which divides closes numbered 1 and 3 from close numbered 2 on the map annexed hereto to a point in the middle of the track or footpath leading northwards from Stanhill Road past Wolfenden Farm and continuing thence northwards along the middle of the last-mentioned track or footpath (thereby crossing Blackburn Road) to the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Oswald, Knuzden, from the said parish of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, Rishton."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Blackburn.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 9th day of February, 1950, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of an alternate share of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the churches and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Stoke Bliss with Kyre in the county and diocese of Worcester:

"Whereas the right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice is at present exercisable alternately by the Right Honourable William Allen, Viscount Jowitt, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, on behalf of Your Majesty, and by the Right Honourable George Herbert Hyde, Earl of Clarendon, K.G., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O. (hereinafter called 'Lord Clarendon'):

"And whereas Lord Clarendon desires to transfer the alternate right of patronage exercisable by him as aforesaid to the Bishop of Worcester for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Worcester (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the share exercisable by Lord Clarendon of and in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said William, Bishop of Worcester, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Worcester for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Worcester.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing dated the 24th day of March, 1950, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners for England, have prepared and now lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme pursuant to the Episcopal Endowments and Stipends Measure, 1943, for vesting in us, the said Church Commissioners, all endowments and other property belonging to, or held in trust for, the Bishopric of Southwark or the Bishop thereof and for securing to the said Bishop the reduced stipend deemed to us appropriate.

"Whereas the Right Reverend Bertram Bishop of Southwark was in occupation of the See at the date of the passing of the aforesaid Measure and has requested us, the said Church Commissioners, to prepare a Scheme with respect to the See:

"And whereas we have prepared this Scheme accordingly after consultation with the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese of Southwark who have offered no objection thereto:

"And whereas the said Bertram Bishop of Southwark has approved the Scheme and in testimony of such approval has appended his signature to the Scheme:

"And whereas the Right Honourable Clement Richard Attlee, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, has signified to us his consent to the preparation and submission of the Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the endowments and property belonging to the See of Southwark or held in trust therefor or for the Bishop thereof are described and referred to in the Schedule hereunder written:

"Now therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners recommend and propose that upon and from the first day of April, 1950, all the endowments securities and other property described and referred to in the said Schedule and all other if any the endowments belonging to or held in trust for the said Bishopric shall vest in us the said Church Commissioners pursuant to the said Measure and that we shall be entitled absolutely to the benefit rents and profit thereof upon and from that date.

"And we further recommend and propose that we shall pay to the Bishop for the time being of the See by equal quarterly instalments in respect of the quarters ended on the thirty-first day of March the thirtieth day of June the thirtieth day of September and the thirty-first day of December in every year
