the first such instalment to be the full quarter's payment due for the quarter ended on the thirtieth day of June 1950 an annual stipend comprising the sum of £2,650 out of which sum he shall defray all the expenses incurred by him in connection with the travelling required in and for the carrying out of his official duties and obligations as Bishop.
