TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 14th April, 1950, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £230,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 17th April, 1950, to Saturday, the 22nd April, 1950, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby announce that They have made an Order under Section 21 of the Finance Act, 1948, replacing Purchase Tax (No. 7) Order, 1949 (S.I. 1949, No. 2443) and revising the classification of greeting cards for purchase tax purposes. Apart from greeting cards all articles affected by the Purchase Tax (No. 7) Order, 1949, revert to the rates obtaining prior the operation of that Order. As regards greeting cards the new Order provides a new line of demarcation between the kinds chargeable at 334 per cent. and those chargeable at 100 per cent. Broadly the 334 per cent. rate will continue to apply to the simpler kinds of cards.
