1. *Age.* Candidates must be at least 28 and under 42 years of age on the 1st January, 1950. But a candidate who has served, or is serving, on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age.

##### TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 1 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, as amended by section 14 of the Special Roads Act, 1949, the effect of which will be that, on the date when the Order comes into operation, a length of the Neath—Abergavenny road in the County Borough of Merthyr Tydfil will become a trunk road and six new roads which he proposes to construct in the Counties of Glamorgan, Brecon and Monmouth and in the County Borough of Merthyr Tydfil will become trunk roads in substitution for five lengths of the Neath—Abergavenny Trunk Road and a length of the East of Abercynon—East of Dowlais Trunk Road and any length of the said Trunk Roads to be superseded by any one of the new roads will cease to be a trunk road on the first day of April next after the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the appropriate Council (who will become the highway authority responsible for the length) that the relevant new road is opened for through traffic.
