TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.

SPECIAL ROADS ACT, 1949.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 14 of the Special Roads Act, 1949, the effect of which will be to provide for the improvement of Millbrook Road at Millbrook, in the County of Southampton, by re-aligning that road from a point approximately 400 yards from its junction with the Folkestone—Brighton—Southampton—Dorchester—Honiton Trunk Road in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 290 yards.

Copies of the draft Order and the plan showing the proposed improvements may be inspected by any person free of charge at all reasonable hours during a period from 19th July, 1950, to 17th October, 1950, at the Ministry of Transport, Berkeley Square House, London, W.1, at the offices of the Southampton County Council, The Castle, Winchester, or at the offices of the Southampton County Borough Council, Civic Centre, Southampton.

TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 1 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, the effect of which will be that

1. Church Street, from its junction with Market Street to its junction with Court Barton;
 2. Court Barton, from its junction with Church Street to its junction with Gouldsbrook Terrace; and
 3. Gouldsbrook Terrace, from its junction with Court Barton to its junction with West Street,
- all in the Urban District of Crewkerne, in the County of Somerset, will become trunk roads on the date on which the Order comes into operation.

Copies of the draft Order and the plan showing the existing roads which will become trunk roads may be inspected by any person free of charge at all reasonable hours during a period from 19th July, 1950, to 17th October, 1950, at the Ministry of Transport, Berkeley Square House, London, W.1, or at the offices of the Somersetshire County Council, County Hall, Taunton, or at the offices of the Crewkerne Urban District Council, Council Offices, Crewkerne, or at the offices of the Divisional Road Engineer, Northernhay Gate, Queen Street, Exeter.

Any person may within the period of three months from 19th July, 1950, object to the making of the Order by notice to the Minister addressed to Berkeley Square House, London, W.1, quoting reference HTR. 33/35/03, and stating the grounds of the objection.

THE LONDON—AYLESBURY—WARWICK—BIRMINGHAM TRUNK ROAD (ST. JOHN'S STREET AND FIELD STREET, BICESTER) ORDER, 1950.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under subsection 2 of Section 1 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, as amended by the Special Roads Act, 1949, whereby

(a) St. John's Street and part of Field Street at Bicester, in the County of Oxford, will become trunk roads on the date on which the Order comes into operation, and

(b) on and after the said date no person shall drive any vehicle in North Street except from north to

south and in St. John's Street except from east to west.

Copies of the Order and of the plan referred to therein have been deposited at the Ministry of Transport, Berkeley Square House, London, W.1, and at the offices of the Oxfordshire County Council, County Hall, Oxford, and at the offices of the Bicester Urban District Council, The Garth, Bicester, and may be seen at all reasonable hours.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, as amended by the Special Roads Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, as so amended has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks of the 21st day of July, 1950, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
