"And whereas it has been found desirable to issue, with effect from 6th August, 1946, Overseas Family Allowances in respect of the families of naval ratings and Royal Marines other ranks, residing at a duty station abroad, such allowances being in place of the allowances provided under the Family Allowances Act, 1945, for families in the United Kingdom:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to sanction by Your Order in Council the payment of Overseas Family Allowances accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, interalia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Forces to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or

Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order

in Council:

"And whereas we consider that the needs of Your Majesty's Fleet render it necessary that provision should be made for the transfer to permanent commissions in the Royal Navy of Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve, the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve

naval Reserve, the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and those holding short service commissions for air duties in the Royal Navy:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the transfer of officers of these categories to permanent commissions in the Royal Navy under the conditions contained in the annexed

"We further beg leave to recommend that we may "We further beg leave to recommend that we may be empowered to apply the terms of Clauses 2 and 3 in the annexed Schedule II to officers already transferred to the Royal Navy from the Royal Naval Reserve, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve or Mercantile Marine under Orders in Council bearing dates 18th March, 1937 (Nos. 139/C.W. and 140/C.W.) and 9th March, 1939 (No. 39/C.W.).

"SCHEDULE I.

"GENERAL CONDITIONS.

"1. The number of Officers selected to be at Admiralty discretion.

"2. Executive Officers, whether permanent or temporary, of the Royal Naval Reserve and the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and Officers holding Short Service Commissions for air duties in the Royal Navy, and permanent and temporary officers of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve Air Branch who are qualified as Pilots or Observers, to be eligible for permanent commissions provided in selection for permanent commissions provided:

"(a) they are of the rank of Acting Sub Lieutenant

or above;

- "(b) they have carried out at least one year's mobilised service as Naval Officers in the Second World War (1939-1945), if under the age of 27, or at least two years' mobilised service as Naval Officers in the Second World War (1939-1945), if over the age of 27.
- "3. Seniority on transfer to be given as follows: (a) Acting Sub Lieutenants to transfer as Sub Lieutenants, Royal Navy, with seniority of date of transfer.
- "(b) Sub Lieutenants to transfer as Sub Lieutenants, Royal Navy, with their seniority as Sub Lieutenants. When such officers have more than one year's service as Naval Officers their seniority as Sub Lieutenants, Royal Navy, will be antedated by half the time served as officers in excess of that period.

"(c) Sub Lieutenants who under the above rules attain one and a half year's seniority, or more, as Sub Lieutenants will be transferred in the rank of Lieutenant, Royal Navy, or in the rank of Acting Lieutenant, Royal Navy, if they are not in possession of a full naval watchkeeping certificate. The seniority of such officers on confirmation of Lieutenant to be that of date of transfer antedated up to a maximum of one year by half the amount of seniority as Sub Lieutenant (calculated on the above basis) in excess of one and a half years.

"(d) Sub Lieutenants over 24 years of age who under the foregoing rules would not qualify for the rank of Lieutenant on transfer, to transfer as Lieutenant, or Acting Lieutenant R.N.,

fer as Lieutenant, or Acting Lieutenant R.N., if not in possession of a watchkeeping certificate, with seniority of date of transfer antedated, in the case of Lieutenants on transfer and in the case of Acting Lieutenants on confirmation as' Lieutenant, so that they will both attain eight years' seniority as Lieutenant at the age of 32.

"(e) Lieutenants to transfer as Lieutenant R.N. and Acting Lieutenants as Acting Lieutenants R.N. and to be confirmed with their original seniority as Lieutenant antedated either:

(i) by half the time served as officers up to a maximum of one year in excess of the minimum qualifying period of one

the minimum qualifying period of one

year or

(ii) so that they will attain eight years' seniority as Lieutenant on reaching the age of 32, whichever is more favourable to the officer.

"(f) Lieutenant Commanders to transfer as Lieutenant Commanders, R.N. with their exist-

ing seniority.

"4. Officers to be considered for promotion to higher rank under the same rules as govern the promotion of other R.N. Officers and to be liable to be retired under the same conditions applicable to other R.N. Officers:

"5. Officers entered for short service air duties in the Royal Navy and permanent and temporary officers of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve Air Branch to be eligible for transfer to permanent commissions in the Engineering Branch of the Royal Navy under the same conditions as for transfer to the Executive Branch except that they will transfer in, or be promoted to, the rank of Lieutenant (E) irrespective of whether they hold a watchkeeping irrespective of whether they hold a watchkeeping certificate or not.

"6. On transfer to the permanent list officers to forfeit all their rights and privileges as Reserve, Temporary Reserve or Short Service Officers and to be eligible for the rates of pay, retired pay and conditions of service applicable to R.N. Officers, except as provided in Schedule II.
