The KING has directed that the appointment of Alan Lennox Thomson NAISH, late Wing Commander (24101), Reserve of Air Force Officers, to be an Additional Officer of the Military Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, dated 1st January, 1946, shall be cancelled and annulled, and his name erased from the Register, in consequence of his having been convicted by the Civil Power, and dismissed from His Majesty's Service.

The KING has been graciously pleased to give and grant unto Richard Francis Cooper, of Laramie in the State of Wyoming in the United States of America, formerly of Culland Hall in the parish of Brailsford in the County of Derby, upon whom has been conferred the decoration of the Military Cross, Lieutenant-Colonel (retired) the Royal Tank Regiment, elder and only surviving son of Arthur Francis Thomas Cooper, late of Culland Hall aforesaid, Gentleman, deceased, by Dorothy, daughter of John William Sowden Collinson, late of Beltoft in the parish of Belton in the County of Lincoln and of Doncaster in the County of York, Gentleman, deceased, and sister of Christopher Barber Collinson, late of Beltoft aforesaid and of Wheatley Field in the parish of North Wheatley in the County of Nottingham, Clerk in Holy Orders, Vicar of Laxton in the said County of Nottingham, also deceased, His Royal Licence and Authority that he may take and henceforth use the surname of Collinson in addition to and before that of Cooper, and that he may bear the Arms of Collinson quarterly with those of his own family Arms and that such surname and Arms may in like manner be taken borne and used by his issue; the said Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in the College of Arms; otherwise the said Royal Licence and Permission to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in the said College of Arms.
