##### DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACTS, 1894 TO 1937.

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of Section 49 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Order:—

##### Statutory Instruments 1950, No. 1445.

*The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 35, 1950. (Made 26th August, 1950.)*

Declares an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles of Bletsoe, Bedford, to be an Infected Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938 are applied. The area subject to restrictions lies in the counties of Bedford, Buckingham, Cambridge, Huntingdon and Northampton.
