Treasury, the following amendment has been made in the Regulations for the Recruitment of Assistant Governors Class II (Women) in the Prison and Borstal Service (England and Wales) published in the London Gazette of the 15th November, 1949, viz.:—

Regulation 1.—Amended to read "Candidates must be at least 21 years of age on the 1st January of the year in which the competition is held. No upper age limit is specified, but in general Government Departments require a reasonable period of service from persons newly appointed to the Civil Service, and accordingly weight may be given to this factor in considering candidates for these posts who are over 50 years of age."

BOROUGH OF ROYAL LEAMINGTON SPA.

TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.
