MILK DISTRIBUTIVE WAGES COUNCIL (ENGLAND AND WALES).

The Milk Distributive Wages Council (England and Wales) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for the fixing of the statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by the First Schedule to the Milk Distributive Wages Council (England and Wales) Wages Regulation (No. 2) Order, 1948 (Order M.D.(56)) as amended by the Milk Distributive Wages Council (England and Wales) Wages Regulation Order, 1949 (Order M.D.(58)).
