"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of All Hallows, Lady Bay'.

"2. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.*

"The said district and parish shall be in the archdeaconry of Nottingham and in the rural deanery of Bingham (West).

"The area comprising:—

"All that part of the parish of West Bridgeford which lies to the north-east of the middle of the Grantham Canal and within the urban district of West Bridgeford."

THE LEEDS CORPORATION TRAMWAYS (CESSEY OF POWERS) ORDER, 1950.

Made 28th September, 1950.

Coming into Operation 29th September, 1950.
