At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 9th day of October, 1950.

PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 10th day of August, 1950 (N.7119/49), in the words following, viz:

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are

therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council;

"And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 20th day of May, 1903, provision was made for the entry of Bandsmen into the Royal Marines:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the Band rank now known as Staff Sergeant should in future be known as Staff Bandmaster to avoid misunderstanding of his status in relation to Bandmasters and Band Sergeants: Band Sergeants:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the alteration of the title from Staff Sergeant to Staff Bandmaster.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have been informed of this alteration."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PRESENT.

The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 27th day of July, 1950, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—
"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituing a new parish to be taken out of the parish of West Bridgeford in the diocese of Southwell.

" Ѕснеме.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas there is no consecrated church within the area and the Church of All Hallows therein has been approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"New therefore with the area of the Point

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Frank Russell, Bishop of Southwell, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. Constitution.

"(a) As from the licence thereto of a Minister the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes until the consecration of the Church of All Hallows therein

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of the said church the area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of All Hallows, Lady Bay'.

"2. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.
"The said district and parish shall be in the archdeaconry of Nottingham and in the rural deanery of Bingham (West).

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—
"All that part of the parish of West Bridgeford which lies to the north-east of the middle
of the Grantham Canal and within the urban
district of West Bridgeford."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Southwell.
