#### PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 5th day of October, 1950, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Ripon (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Saint Michael, Farnley, and a part of the benefice of Bramley both situate in the diocese of Ripon.

"1. With the consents (testified by their signing this Scheme) of the Reverend David John Alfred Evans and of the Reverend Richard Allen Talbot as the incumbents respectively of the said benefices of Saint Michael, Farnley, and Bramley, upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette a part of the benefice and parish of Bramley (the boundaries of which part are described in the First Schedule hereto and are shown on the map annexed to this Scheme) shall be severed from the

rirst Schedule hereto and are shown on the map annexed to this Scheme) shall be severed from the remaining part of that benefice and parish and united to the benefice and parish of Saint Michael, Farnley.

"2. Upon the union taking effect the incumbent of the benefice of Saint Michael, Farnley, shall employ an assistant curate to assist him in performing the duties of the benefice and in particular to serve the mission church at Hough End but in the event of the services of a whole-time assistant curate not of the services of a whole-time assistant curate not

of the services of a whole-time assistant curate not being available the said incumbent shall employ such clerical or such lay assistance as the Bishop of Ripon may from time to time direct.

"3. Upon the union taking effect the endowments specified in the Second Schedule hereto shall be severed or diverted from the benefice of Bramley and shall be annexed to, and held by us, the said Church Commissioners as part of the endowment of the benefice of Saint Michael, Farnley, and the said endowments shall be appropriated as a fund towards the cost of providing the assistance mentioned in Clause cost of providing the assistance mentioned in Clause 2 of this Scheme and the income of the said fund shall be received by the incumbent of the benefice of Saint Michael, Farnley, as part of the income of the said benefice subject to and charged with payment of the cost of providing such assistance.

#### "FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory (shown by the pink colour on the map annexed to this Scheme) to be united to the parish of Saint Michael, Farnley:—

"All that portion of the parish of Bramley which lies to the south of the middle of the railway line of

the Leeds, Bradford and Halifax Branch of the British Railways (North Eastern Region).

"SECOND SCHEDULE.

"(Endowments of the benefice of Bramley to be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Saint Michael, Farnley).

"1. Capital fund amounting, with arrears of income unpaid, to £568 1s. 3d. on the 31st March, 1950, paid as a benefaction and held by us, the Church Commissioners, as a fund towards the remuneration of an assistant curate, together with all income thereon unpaid upon the day when Clause 3 of this Scheme comes into effect.

"2. Grant by us the said Church Commissioners

"2. Grant by us the said Church Commissioners of £15 per annum to meet the benefaction mentioned in paragraph 1 of this Schedule conditional upon the employment of an assistant curate within the parish of Bramley.

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

RECRUITMENT UNDER NORMAL REGULATIONS TO THE SENIOR BRANCH OF THE FOREIGN SERVICE.

1. No candidate may compete more than twice in all under Normal and Reconstruction Regulations.

2. Age.

Candidates must be at least 204 years and under 24 years of age on the 1st day of August, 1951, but

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age;

(b) a candidate who has served in H.M. Forces otherwise than on a regular engagement may deduct the period of such service from his actual age, up to a maximum of two years.

#### 3. Marriage.

Both men and women may compete under these Regulations; but

(a) every woman candidate must be unmarried or

a widow;
(b) women will normally be required to resign their appointments on marriage, but in exceptional cases they may be retained with the permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.

The approval of the Secretary of State is required before a successful male candidate who is married takes up appointment.

#### 4. Nationality.

(1) Every candidate must

(a) be a natural-born British subject; and (b) have been born within the United Kingdom or within one of the self-governing Dominions of parents both of whom were also born within the United Kingdom or within one of the self-governing Dominions.

- (2) No departure from this rule will be made without the special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and then only in exceptional cases and in favour of candidates who are British subjects and who also satisfy one of the following conditions:—
  - (a) If natural-born British subjects, they must

(i) have at least one parent who is, or was at

- death, a British subject; or

  (ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.
- (b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at last five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.
- (c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this sub-paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions, either by ancestry, upbring-ing, or residence, or by reason of national ser-vice, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

#### 5. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

- (i) Candidates must either (a) have obtained at least second crass honours in a full final honours degree examination at a recognised University, or (b) be in the last year of a course for a full honours degree at a recognised University. In the latter case, they will not be declared successful unless they can produce evidence, not later than 1st September, 1951, that they have obtained at least second class honours in their degree examination.
