REGULATIONS FOR THE CONTROL OF THE ADMIRALTY WATERS AT GIBRALTAR, AS DEFINED BY ORDER IN COUNCIL OF 22ND MARCH, 1911.

The following shall be substituted for the Regulations dated 12th October, 1932, and confirmed by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty on 18th October, 1932, and amended by a regulation dated 13th January, 1937, and confirmed by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty on 26th January, 1937:—

The limits of the Admiralty Waters are as follows:—

All the water area lying between the shore and the following line, namely from a point on the highwater line 60 yards south of the root of Rosia mole in a direction 272° for a distance of 115 yards, thence 310° for a distance of 340 yards, thence along lines parallel to and 200 yards from the South and Detached moles respectively and including the North and South Entrances, thence along lines parallel to and 50 yards from the faced wall of the North Mole, thence to the shore along the North Mole, the boundaries being as delineated on the chart attached to the Order in Council bearing date the 22nd March, 1911.

The term King's Harbour Master used in these regulations includes any person for the time being performing the duties of Harbour Master under the direction of the Senior Naval Officer.

The term approved pilot used in these regulations means a pilot approved by the Senior Naval Officer or the King's Harbour Master in accordance with the provisions of clause 3 hereof.

1. No merchant or other private vessel shall enter Admiralty Waters without the permission of the King's Harbour Master.

2. The approval of the Admiral Superintendent, H.M. Dockyard, Gibraltar, must be obtained before any change taking effect whilst a vessel is in Admiralty Waters is made in the complement of the crew of that vessel or in the complement of the passengers thereof. The responsibility for obtaining such approval being that of the master of the vessel or her agent and not of the shipping master.

When these signals are displayed, no merchant or other private vessel shall attempt to enter, leave, or move within Admiralty Waters in the vicinity of the entrance indicated until such time as the signals are hauled down.

NOTE.—At the lighthouses referred to above, these signals will be displayed in a position vertically above the navigational light.

During hostilities, the above signals will not be shown from the Dockyard Tower.

8. Moorings for H.M. Ships, mark buoys, or other aids to navigation, and such other buoys as may be required for any purpose in connection with naval or military operations, shall be placed by the King's Harbour Master, as from time to time the requirements of H.M. Service may demand.

9. Moorings for private vessels may be laid with the permission, in writing, of the King's Harbour Master, and in such positions as he shall deem fit, but such moorings shall be forthwith removed on the requisition of the King's Harbour Master to that effect.

10. If at any time the anchor of any merchant or other private vessel hooks any Government moorings, or any electric cables, or moorings of buoys, the master or other person in charge or command of such vessel shall not proceed to unhook the same, but shall forthwith give notice thereof to the King's Harbour Master, in order that aid may be given for clearing such moorings or cables without doing damage to the same.

11. No Merchant or other private vessel or boat shall make fast to, or lie at any of the Government quays, wharves, buoys, piles, or mark buoys, without permission, in writing, from the King's Harbour Master.

Vessels which have had permission to berth in Admiralty Waters should, if they return to Harbour after an absence of more than twenty-four hours, apply again for such permission.

3. The Senior Naval Officer, or King's Harbour Master, shall be the authority for approving pilots for the purpose of conducting ships within the Admiralty Waters at Gibraltar; and it shall be lawful for the said Senior Naval Officer or King's Harbour Master, from time to time to make and, when made, to alter or revoke such regulations, in writing, as he may deem expedient, for the examination of such pilots for their suitability for the performance of pilotage within the Admiralty Waters of Gibraltar.

4. No merchant or other private vessel shall enter, anchor, berth, moor, navigate within, or leave Admiralty Waters without having on board an approved pilot. When in the opinion of the King's Harbour Master the use of tugs is necessary to carry out any movement of a vessel with safety, such tugs must have been previously approved by him as suitable for such work, and in the event of Admiralty tugs being employed an Admiralty pilot will always be placed in charge of the movement. The Admiralty shall determine the amount which shall be paid for the service of any tugs belonging to or employed by the Admiralty attending and assisting the vessel and the cost or price or hire of any Dockyard labour or materials or apparatus supplied by the Admiralty.

5. Notwithstanding any enactment or order to the contrary, no pilot acting as such on board a merchant or private vessel shall be deemed to be a servant of the Admiralty, even though in the course of his ordinary duties he may be such a servant.

6. Notwithstanding anything in any enactment or order to the contrary, the owners or masters of a vessel entering, anchoring, berthing, mooring, navigating within or leaving the Admiralty Waters with an approved pilot on board shall be answerable for any loss or damage caused by the vessel in the same manner as they would be if the employment of such a pilot were not compulsory.

7. When any of H.M. Ships (or vessels moving under direct orders of the King's Harbour Master) are about to enter or leave Admiralty Waters the following signals will be displayed at the Dockyard Tower by direction of the Senior Naval Officer and repeated at the Lighthouses at the North end of the South Mole and at the South end of the North Mole:—

12. No ballast, stones, sand, earth, clay, refuse, ash, rubbish, dust, sewage matter, nor filth of any description, and no refuse from any quarry, mine or pit, nor any other material, shall, except in such places and subject to such conditions as may be approved by the King's Harbour Master, be unladen, cast or allowed to fall or to be washed into the Admiralty Waters.

It is absolutely forbidden to discharge or allow to be washed into Admiralty Waters any oil fuel or other types of oil, any washings from oil fuel tanks, oily waste or residue. Arrangements for the removal of oil fuel residue and oily washings from tanks can be made by the Dockyard authorities on application. Pumping out of bilge water or other water containing oily residue in Admiralty Waters is also absolutely forbidden.

13. The steam siren shall not be used within Admiralty Waters except to prevent collision or in case of fog.

14. Merchant and other private vessels carrying explosives on board shall fly a red flag by day and shall display a red light at the masthead during dark hours. Such vessels shall provide at least two appropriate watchmen or if none are available shall embark two guards, supplied by the Captain of the Port, for whom payment shall be made by the Master or other person in charge of the vessel, before clearance at such rates as may at the time be in force.

No explosives, petroleum spirit in quantities in excess of the amounts authorised for storage locally without special licence, or other dangerous store shall be discharged, landed or transhipped without the permission in writing of the King's Harbour Master. Except to discharge or load cargo, hatches of holds in which petroleum spirit, explosives or other dangerous stores are stored shall not be removed, and, if hatches be removed to discharge or load cargo, all proper precautions shall be taken to prevent danger.

While alongside, hoses shall be kept rigged and, together with other fire appliances, ready for immediate use.

15. Fires, lights and smoking shall not be allowed on board any vessel with hatches off whilst embarking or discharging explosives, petroleum spirit or other dangerous stores, or whilst alongside any vessel with hatches off and loaded with explosives, petroleum spirit or other dangerous stores.

The operation of electrical machinery and equipment and of safety lamps shall not be permitted where these conditions obtain unless the gear is of approved construction, *i.e.*, 'flameproof for vessels carrying inflammable fluid and water-tight or dust-tight for vessels carrying explosives.

Ships carrying dangerous stores and those lying in berths adjacent to such ships shall not use paraffin or oil lamps in place of the electric lighting installation or safety lamps of approved construction.

The only permissible exceptions to the above instructions are as follows:—

(a) Stoking of engine-room fires may continue when steam is required for working winches or for other essential purposes. When steam is not so required engine-room fires are to be carefully banked and are not to be spread while hatches are open in the vessel or in other vessels alongside, or while explosives, petroleum spirit or other dangerous stores remain on the wharf.

(b) Galley fires may be kept alight provided the galley funnel is led into the main funnel, or the galley is well clear of the cargo hold and galley doors kept shut.

(c) Riding and Navigation lights are excepted.

(d) Electric cabin, cargo and fore-castle lights and small cabin fans of the protected type in living accommodation spaces are excepted.

(e) Smoking at meal times may be permitted in places specially authorised by the Master for the purpose.

Fires, lights and smoking by members of ships crews may be permitted during non-working hours when alongside provided that:

(i) hatches are closed,

(ii) no explosives, petroleum spirit or other dangerous stores are on the wharf, and

(iii) no other vessels with explosives, petroleum spirit or other dangerous stores on board and with hatches off are alongside in adjacent berths.

16. All Merchant or other private vessels within Admiralty Waters shall carry out such instructions as they may receive from time to time from the King's Harbour Master or other officer acting on his behalf, with respect to putting out fires or lights, or other precautions deemed necessary for the prevention of fire. Every outbreak of fire in such vessels should be immediately reported to the police and to the Dockyard Fire Service. The latter will then despatch the necessary fire appliances to the ship or vessel and the responsibility for deciding what degree of assistance is required to be rendered by the Dockyard Fire Service rests with the Dockyard Fire Officer.

17. No firearms or air guns shall be discharged on any ship or other vessel or boat within Admiralty Waters.

18. No ship's gun on board any merchant or other private vessel shall be kept loaded nor discharged, except as a signal of distress, within Admiralty Waters.

19. No trawling nor fishing by nets, whether drift nets or set nets, shall be at any time carried on in the Admiralty Waters without the permission of the King's Harbour Master.

20. All sea-going vessels, when within the limits of the Admiralty Waters, shall carry such lights as are prescribed by the "Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea" made from time to time under the Imperial Merchant Shipping Acts, and all vessels of every description shall also observe the steering and sailing rules set forth in such regulations.

21. The master of every merchant or other private vessel, or person in charge of any boat to which these regulations apply, shall observe, and cause to be observed, these regulations as far as they apply to his vessel or boat; and if any master, or other person, acts in any respect in contravention of these regulations, or fails to observe or cause to be observed in any respect any of these regulations, or to take all proper precautions to prevent accident, he will be liable in accordance with

Clause 14 of the Order-in-Council of 22nd March, 1911, to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds, and the vessel shall be liable to be removed from Admiralty Waters at the expense of the owners and in such manner as the King's Harbour Master shall direct.
