- 11. To confirm an agreement between the Corporation and the British Transport Commission with reference to the commutation of rates and charges, the dredging of the Lymington River, and other matters and to apply the said agreement to the Commissioners.
- 12. To prevent the removal or sailing from the harbour of any vessel in respect of which, or the goods on which any rates payable have not been

paid.

13. To enable the Commissioners to sell or lease their undertaking or any part thereof or the right to collect and retain rates and charges.

14. To authorise the Commissioners to borrow money for all or any of the purposes of the Order and to charge the moneys so to be borrowed and the interest thereon upon the revenue of the undertaking and to provide for the repayment of the said moneys.

- and to provide for the repayment of the said moneys and the purposes to which they shall be applied.

  15. To authorise the Commissioners to form and maintain reserve and sinking funds, to enact provisions with regard to the application of the harbour revenue and the mode of payment off of money borrowed, the re-borrowing of money and other financial matters.
- 16. To enact provisions with regard to byelaws.17. To authorise the Minister of Transport to hold inquiries.
- 18. To provide that the Commissioners shall, whenever required by the Minister of Transport, provide a lifeboat and other life-saving apparatus and to enact provisions with regard thereto.

  19. To enable the Commissioners to cause sunk or stranded vessels to be raised, removed or blown up or otherwise destroyed and to sell any vessel and effects which may be raised or salved.

20. To provide that the Commissioners shall have the appointment of meters and weighers and that they

shall be a local lighthouse authority.

21. To incorporate with or apply to the Order all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Harbours Docks and Piers Clauses Act, 1847, the Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847, and any amendment or modification of the said Acts.

22. To vary or extinguish all or any rights and privileges which would or might interfere with the objects of the intended Order and to confer other rights and privileges.
