From Guardalupa, March 17.
N the 7th Instant Colonel Coarington, Governor of Her Majesty's Leeward Hands, came with; the Land Forces under his Command on board a Squadron of Her Majefty's Ships, with divers Privareers and other Veilels, off this Island: Several Shot were fired at us from the Shore, yet without doing us any other Mischief than the killing of a Man, and wounding a Boy on board the Commadore. We frood off and on till the 10th, waiting for Her Majesty's Ship the Maidsone, and our small Ships which were off Mary-Galanta; and when they were arrived, we came to an Anchor on the North West Calanta Said Total and Anchor on the North West Calanta Said Total the North-West side of this Island, and some the North-West side of this siland, and some Parties of our Men were sent ashore to destroy some scattering Plantations of the French, which they did. The 12th Colonel Byam with his Regiment, and a Detachment of 200 Men of Colonel Whetham's Regiment, landed by break of day at a Place called Les Perirs Habitants, where they met with some opposition, but soon obliged the Enemy to retire About 9 in the morning Colonel Whetham, with 800 Men more, landed in a Pay to the Northward of a Town landed in a Bay to the Northward of a Town called the Bayliffe, where we mer with a most vigorous Reliftance of all the Enemy's Forces, posted in very good and advantagious Breast-works, plying us continually with their great and small Shot while we were Landing, and firing particularly in a more furious manner at the Flag: Yet notwithstanding all their Fire, our Men bravely marched up to their Intrenchments with their Muskets Shouldered, without firing one Shot till fuch time as they could come up to lay the Muzzels of their Pieces upon the top of the Enemy's Breaftworks. We had 3 Captains killed at the head of the Grana-diers before we could make our felves Masters of the Enemy's first Breastwork: Colonel Willis tignalized himself in this Action with great Bravery; And in a word both Officers and Soldiers fought with all the Courage and Refolution maginable. By noon we were Masters of all the Enemy's Outworks; In an hour after of the Town called the Bayliffe, of the Jacobine's Church which they had fortified, and of 10 Pieces of their Cannon: About two in the afremoon we took a Platform, where they had planted three Pieces of Cannon, and a Redoubt with one. At night a Detachment of 400 Men, and the Regiment of Marines, attacked the Ja-tobing Plantation, and the Breaftwork along the Jacobine's River, which is perhaps the strongest and the most advantagious in all the Indies, which they quitted after we had fired but two Volleys or small Shot at them; and indeed they generally made but a weak Defence, tho their Posts were the best fortified that ever were seen in these Parts, and might have cost the dear. The near they managed the wishout us dear. The next day we marched, without any other opposition than of their Cannon playing continually upon us, and possessed our selves of the great Town called Bassettere, where we have continued ever fince, fending out Parties to burn and destroy all their Houses, Works,

Sugar-Canes, and Provisions hereabouts. We laid Siege to the Fort and Castle of this Place, and are now advanced within Pithol-shot of the former, and within Musker-shot of the Castle, and we are working with all diligence to get our Batteries ready, which will consist of 16 Pieces of Cannon, some whereof will begin to play before night.

Falmouch, May 3. A Sloop is lately arrived at Penzance from the West Indies; the Master whereof reports, That before he came away Her Majesty's Forces in the Leeward Itlands had taken the Island of Guardalupa, belonging to the French, and were gone to Marchico, another of the Enemy's Sertiements, where it is hoped they may have met with the like Success. Yéfterday arrived here in two days from Dublin Her Majetty's Ships the Bridgwater, Mermaid, and Shoreham. Captain Gilfon in the Bridgwater being Commadore; together with 7 sports, having on board Colonel Merediel's and Colonel Stanhop's Regiments of Foot, and 8 Merchant Ships under their Convoy 3 all bound to Holland This day paffed by here to the Westward a confiderable number of our ontward bound Merchant Ships, under Convoy (as is reported by the Masters of dome of our Tin Ships who are come in from them) of 14 Men of War.

Briftol, May 5. This day came in here the Hopewel Sloop of New-York, Henry York Mafter, in 5 weeks and 5 days from News. A week before he came away from thence they had an Account, That Her Majesty's Forces under the Command of Colonel Codringron had taken the Hland of Guarda's pa, except the Fort at Baffeterre, and another called the Dadaw Peck, into which the Inhabitants were retired with their Families and their best Effects; and that they hid raised a Battery against the Fort, and as 100n as their Cannon was come up, they did not doubt of being Matters of it in a front time: They had loft about 200 Men at their Landing. Her Majetty's Ship the Feversteam, bound to Ireland. Hes in King's Road, ready to fail with the first fair Wind; as do alto leveral outward-bound Merchant Ships. The Conterbury and Suffoli Storeships are taking in Timber in Harg-Road for the use of Her Majesty's Dock at Pilineuth.

Portforub, May 6. Vice-Admiral Leaks failed yesterday in the afternoon from Spickead to the Westward, on board Her Majerty's Ship the Sommerfee, with intent to join Her Majerty's Fieet commanded by Sir George Rooke.

Whitehall, May 7. Sir George Role, being taken to ill at Sea with a Feaver and the Gone, that he is not in a Condition to proceed on his intended Voyage, in pursuance of the Orders he had received from his Royal Highness the

Lord High Admiral; George Churchill EK; Admiral of the Elue, is appointed to Command, in his room, that part of Her Majesty's Fleet wherewith he lately failed from Spiritead to the Weitward 5 And Admiral Chirchill accordingly went from hence this morning for Portsmouth, intending to follow Sir George Rooke to Plimouth on board one of Her Majesty's Ships at Spirbead, in order to repair to his said Command. Sir Stafford Fairborne is gone with him, being appointed to Command under him as Vice-Admiral, in the place of Vice-Admiral Leake, who is to return to Spirhead to Sir Cloudefly Shove!.

There are Two Mails due from Holland.

Whitehall, May 9. An Express arrived here late this evening from the Camp before Bon, with Letters of the 16th Instant, N. S. giving an Account of the Surrender of that Place. The Fort on the other fide of the Rhine had been taken on the 9th, part of the French Gaution that was in it retiring in Boats to the Town, and the rest, to the number of 40, being killed or taken Prisoners. On the 13th the Beileged made a Sally, but were repulfed with the Lois of above 100 killed, and as many wounded, and not half the Loss on our side. About 8 that evening an Affault was made on the Counterfearp on the fide of the Prince of Heffe's Attack, and in less than an hour's time our Men had made their intended Lodgment, in which Action Major-General Tettau was slightly wounded; 6 or 7 Officers more were wounded, an Enginite killed, and near 160 private Soldiers killed and wounded. The set of English the Engineering wounded. and wounded. The 14th the Enemy beat a Parley, and the Articles were agreed last night, and this morning one of the Gates was given into our Possession. The Garison is to march out the 18th, and to be conducted to Luxenburgh, except the Regiment of Volskirke, and two Independent Companies belonging to the Electorate of Cologue, which are kept in the Service of the Chapter of this Arbishoprick. His Grace the Duke of Marlberough having thus happily finished this Siege, stays here this asternoon to settle all Matters, and intends to go from hence to morrow, in order to be the next day with the Army on the Maefe.
