6. *Candidates trained as Teachers.*

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

7. *Fee.*

A fee of 7s. 6d. is payable by all candidates. This must be sent with the application form, and is not returnable in any circumstances.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held on the 20th March, 1951, under the above Regulations.

No person will be admitted to the Examination from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received on or before the 22nd February, 1951, an application on the prescribed form, a copy of which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.

SPECIAL ROADS ACT, 1949.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he has made the following Orders:—

(1) An Order under section 1 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, as extended by section 14 of the Special Roads Act, 1949, the effect of which is that a diversion which he proposes to construct at Stamford Bridge in the County of Chester to supersede a length of the Swansea—Manchester Trunk Road will become a trunk road on the date of the coming into operation of the Order, and that the length of the said Trunk Road superseded thereby will cease to be a trunk road on the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Cheshire County Council (who will thereafter become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the diversion is opened for through traffic.

Copies of this Order, the short title of which is "The Swansea—Manchester Trunk Road (Stamford Bridge Diversion) Order, 1951," can be purchased price 2d. either through any bookseller or direct from His Majesty's Stationery Office at the following addresses:—York House, Kingsway, London, W.C.2; 39, King Street, Manchester 2; 2, Edmund Street, Birmingham 3; 1, St. Andrew's Crescent, Cardiff; Tower Lane, Bristol 1; and 13a, Castle Street, Edinburgh 2.

(2) An Order under section 14 of the Special Roads Act, 1949, the effect of which is:—

(a) to provide for the construction by the Minister of two new lengths of road at Stamford Bridge in the County of Chester to connect the Swansea—Manchester Trunk Road with the new diversion and to provide for the stopping up, when the new roads are opened for through traffic, of two lengths of the said Trunk Road at its eastern and western junctions respectively with the proposed diversion;

(b) that the Council of the County of Chester will become the highway authority for the new roads on the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Council that the new roads are opened for through traffic.

Copies of this Order, the short title of which is "The Swansea—Manchester Trunk Road (Stamford Bridge Improvements) Order, 1951," can be obtained from the Ministry of Transport, Stationery Section, Berkeley Square House, London, W.1.

Copies of both Orders and of the plans referred to therein have been deposited at the Ministry of Transport, Berkeley Square House, (London, W.1, and at the offices of the Cheshire County Council, County Offices, St. John's House, Chester, and may be seen at all reasonable hours.

Any person aggrieved by either of the said Orders and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, as amended by the Special Roads Act, 1949, or, as the case may be, of the Special Roads Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of these Acts or of any regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Order, may,

within six weeks of the 2nd day of February, 1951, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT, 1950.

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of Section 85 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Orders:—

Statutory Instruments 1951, No. 126.

The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 3, 1951.

(Made 24th January, 1951.)

Declares an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles of Mythop, Blackpool, Lancashire, to be an Infected Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938 are applied. The area subject to restrictions lies in the county of Lancaster.

Statutory Instruments 1951, No. 130.

The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Controlled Areas) Special Order No. 1, 1951.

(Made 24th January, 1951.)

Declares an area comprising the counties of Chester, Derby, Stafford and West Riding of Yorkshire, and part of the county of Lancaster, to be a Controlled Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Controlled Areas Restrictions) General Order of 1938 are applied.

Statutory Instruments 1951, No. 134.

The Tuberculosis (Zetland Attested Area) Order, 1951 (Made 23rd January, 1951.)

Declares the county of Zetland, including the burgh of Lerwick, to be an Attested Area for purposes connected with the control of tuberculosis, with effect from 1st February, 1951. Accordingly, as from that date, that area will be subject to the provisions of the Tuberculosis (Area Eradication) Order, 1950 (S.I. 1950, No. 2006).

Statutory Instruments 1951, No. 135.

The Tuberculosis (Isles of Scilly Attested Area) Order, 1951 (Made 23rd January, 1951.)

Declares the Isles of Scilly to be an Attested Area for purposes connected with the control of tuberculosis, with effect from 1st February, 1951. Accordingly, as from that date, that area will be subject to the provisions of the Tuberculosis (Area Eradication) Order, 1950 (S.I. 1950, No. 2006).

Statutory Instruments 1951, No. 136.

The Tuberculosis (Bute No. 1 Attested Area) Order, 1951 (Made 23rd January, 1951.)

Declares the islands of Arran, Great Cumbrae and Little Cumbrae in the county of Bute to be an Attested Area for purposes connected with the control of tuberculosis, with effect from 1st February, 1951. Accordingly, as from that date, that area will be subject to the provisions of the Tuberculosis (Area Eradication) Order, 1950 (S.I. 1950, No. 2006).

Statutory Instruments 1951, No. 147.

The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 4, 1951 (Made 26th January, 1951.)

Extends the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Burley in Wharfedale, Ilkley, Yorkshire, declared by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 2, 1951, so as to include an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 5 miles of Brighouse, Yorkshire.
