RECRUITMENT UNDER NORMAL REGULATIONS OF PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS (HIGHER DEPARTMENTAL GRADES) IN THE MINISTRY OF SUPPLY.

1. Sex and Marriage.

(i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established Civil Servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity raid marriage gratuity paid.

2. Age.
Candidates must be at least 30 years of age on 1st January, 1951. The Commissioners have not specified an upper age limit for this competition. In general, however, Government Departments require a reasonable period of service from persons newly appointed to the Civil Service; and accordingly the Commissioners reserve the right to give weight to this factor when considering candidates for these posts who are over 50 years off age.
