Milan, May 4. N. S.

LL the French and Italian Horse which were quartered within this Dutchy began to march the 2d Inthant towards Cremona, where they are ordered to be by the 10th, and the Foot will likewise leave their Quarters in a very forr time: It is faid the greatest part of these Troups is to be employed in continuing the Blockade of Berfello, and that those which are at piesent posted about that Town will be ordered to join the main Army under the Com-mand of the Duke de Verdofme. The Garifon of that Place, notwithstanding its having been fo long blocked up, appears to be in no want of Nederlaries, but frequently makes Excurtions with very good Succels, in tome of which they have had the good fortune to feize feveral Boars on the Po, which were laden with Corn, and other Provisions, for the use of the French Army; and in all appearance, flould they arrack that Town by way of a formal Siege, (which Defign has been much discouried of, but teems now to be laid aside) it would fill be able to make a very good Defence.

Minimum, May 4. Four Regiments of Foot are marched out of this Garison, in order to join the French Forces which are gathering together near San Giacomo, in order, as is given out, to tome confiderable Enterprise, which is kept fociet. Florence, May 5. Sir Lamkert Blackwell, Her Majesty of Great Britain's Envoy Extraordinary, had Publick Audience the 28th Instant of the Great Duke of Tuscany, and of the Prince and Princess.

Rome, May 5. The Pope grows daily herrer in his Health, and goes abroad again, and applies himself to the Difpatch of publick Affairs. There have lately been feveral Confultations held between his Ministers about the raising of Money to support the extraordinary Charge he is at, in this time of War, to maintain the Forces he is obliged to keep on foot for the Security of his own Territories: And it is faid that, in confideration of the great Loffes which his Subjects have fusiained by the late dreadful Storms and Earthquakes, he has resolved notro burthen them with any new Taxes, but rather to borrow Money at Interest of the Republick of Genoua. It is faid, the Pope intends to erest a new Bank in this City.
