COUNTY BOROUGH OF SUNDERLAND.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Sunderland (hereinafter called "the Corporation") have made application to the Minister of Local Government and Planning (hereinafter called "the Minister") for the issue of an Order under section 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partly to alter or amend section 188 of the Sunderland Corporation Act, 1935, (hereinafter called "the local Act") so as:—

NOTICE OF SUBMISSION OF PRELIMINARY DRAFT OF REGULATIONS ENTITLED THE NATIONAL INSURANCE (CLASSIFICATION) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS, 1951.

In accordance with Section 77 of the National Insurance Act, 1946, the National Insurance Advisory Committee give notice that they have received from the Minister of National Insurance for consideration and report thereon the preliminary draft of regulations entitled the National Insurance (Classification) Amendment Regulations, 1951.

A short explanatory note on these regulations is appended to this notice.

The Committee will take into consideration any objections, made by or on behalf of persons affected, sent to them before 17th April, 1951. Having regard to the terms of the Act, which provides that objections must be made within a period of 28 days at most, the Committee are unable to allow a longer period within which objections may be submitted. If an objection is submitted within the prescribed time, however, the Committee will be prepared, if they are satisfied that sufficient grounds exist, to allow the later submission of evidence or explanation in support of the objection. EXPLANATORY NOTE.

These Regulations amend the National Insurance (Classification) Regulations, 1948, by including among the employments in respect of which persons are treated as non-employed persons, employment as a member of the National Hospital Service Reserve. Any person rendering services in this employment for forty-eight hours or more within any period of seven consecutive days is excepted from the operation of this provision.
