Pursuant to Section 207 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876 I hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers conferred on me by the Customs Acts and enactments amending and extending those Acts, I have seized as forfeited 3 bales marked 204, 205 and 206 containing 2,032 raw mink skins which were imported by Ariowitsch and Jacob Fur Co. Ltd. whose registered office is situate at Miniver Place, Garlick Hill in the City of London at London Airport on the 7th day of February, 1951, on the ground that the said bales contained goods not corresponding with the entry thereof.

Whereby and by force of Section 67 of the said Act the said bales are forfeited.

If you claim or intend to claim that the said bales are not liable to forfeiture you should within one calendar month from the date of this Notice give notice of your claim or intended claim in accordance with the provisions of the said Section 207 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876 and in default of such notice the said bales will be deemed to have been lawfully condemned and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct.

EXTINGUISHMENT OF PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Local Government and Planning, in exercise of powers conferred by Section 23 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1944, as incorporated with the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, proposes to make an Order extinguishing the public right of way over part of The Meadway, Shoreham-by-Sea.

USE OF LAND FOR THE WAR DEPARTMENT.

PUBLIC LOCAL INQUIRY.

Upper Hulme.

The Minister of Local Government and Planning has instructed K. S. Dodd, Esq., M.C., M.A., M.T.P.I., Inspector, to hold a Public Local Inquiry for the purpose of hearing representations as to the effect on the public interest of the proposal of the War Department to use land shown on the map of which copies have been deposited for public inspection at the offices of the Staffordshire County Council in Stafford and the Leek Rural District Council in Leek. A statement of the use to which the War Department propose to put the land and a copy of Command Paper 7278 ("Needs of the Armed Forces for Land for Training and Other Purposes," Part IX of which deals with the procedure for examining such proposals) have also been deposited for public inspection at the offices of the above-mentioned local authorities. Mr. Dodd will accordingly attend at the Town Hall, Leek at 10.30 a.m. on Wednesday, the 2nd May, 1951.

Any person desirous of making such representations is requested to notify the Minister of Local Government and Planning, 23, Savile Row, London, W.1, as soon as possible, and in any case not later than the 21st April of his wish to do so, and of the general nature of the representations he desires to make.
