DISCONTINUANCE.

THE BURIAL GROUNDS (CHIPPING CAMPDEN) ORDER, 1951.

Made - - - 9th April, 1951

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 9th day of April, 1951.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, did, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853 (16 & 17 Vict. c. 134), as amended by subsequent enactments, make a Representation to His Majesty in Council that for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Chipping Campden in the County of Gloucester, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as herein-after directed:

And Whereas by an Order in Council of the 29th January, 1951, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 12th day of March next, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

And Whereas by an Order in Council of the 29th January, 1951 (S.I. 1951 No. 142), the functions of the Minister of Health under the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, were transferred to the Minister of Local Government and Planning:
