TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946. SPECIAL ROADS ACT, 1949.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 14 of the Special Roads Act, 1949, the effect of which will be

(a) to provide for the construction by the Minister of two new roads and for the widening of a length of the road linking Five Lanes End with Mansfield Road in the Rural District of East Retford in the County of Nottingham to provide an alternative route from Mansfield Road to the Liverpool—Warrington—Stockport—Sheffield—Lincoln—Skegness Trunk Road;

(b) to provide for the stopping up of that part of Mansfield Road which forms its junction with the said Trunk Road and of two lengths of the road linking Five Lanes End with Mansfield Road;
(c) that the Council of the County of Nottingham will become the highway authority for the new roads on the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Council that the improvements are completed, and the new roads are opened for completed and the new roads are opened for through traffic.
