ALFRETON URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Wingfield Road, Alfreton, Footpath Diversion
Confirmation Order, 1951.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 9th day of April 1951 the Ministry of Local Government and Planning confirmed, with modifications, the above order.

The effect of the order is to divert the public right of way running off the Wingfield Road, Alfreton, in the direction of Oakerthorpe Brook for a distance of approximately 120 yards to a new line to the east of approximately 180 yards, the point of entry to be approximately the same as hitherto.

Chanctonbury (Henfield—Bineham Bridge)
Diversion Order, 1950.
