

MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1947.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 49 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, entitled "The Stopping up of Highways (Derbyshire) (No. 3) Order, 1951" authorising the stopping up of part of a footpath leading to Markham Colliery No. 2, Sutton-Cum-Duckmanton, in the County of Derby and requiring the provision of a new footpath.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks of the 1st of May, 1951, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

Notice is hereby given that on the 25th day of April, 1951, the Minister of Transport made the London Traffic (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Amendment) Order, 1951 (S.I. 1951 No. 736).

The London Traffic (Miscellaneous Provisions) Order, 1948, as amended imposes restrictions on street trading and on vehicles with regard to waiting in certain streets in the Metropolitan Boroughs.

The Order of 1951 further amends the Order of 1948 by excluding therefrom certain streets to which more extensive restrictions will apply on and after 4th May, 1951, under Regulations made by the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, as extended by the Public Works (Festival of Britain) Act, 1949.
