1. In Article 17 (2) (which provides for the supplementation of retired pay or pension for unemployable pensioners) for the figures £78 and 30s. there shall be substituted the figures £91 and 35s.

2. In proviso (ii) to subparagraph (d) of Article 17 (3) (which provides for the payment of additional allowances for dependants of unemployable pensioners) for the figures 23s. 6d. there shall be substituted the figures 26s.

3. In Article 17 (3), after the proviso to subparagraph (e) (ii) there shall be added the following subparagraph:—

"(f) Where, in the case of a member of the naval forces not being an officer, the amount of the allowance in respect of the first child awarded under Article 13 or awarded or increased under subparagraph (e) of this paragraph is 7s. 6d. a week, a further allowance of 2s. 6d. a week may be awarded in respect of that child."

4. After Article 17, amended as aforesaid, there shall be inserted the following Article:—

"17A. Allowances for Comforts.—Where a member of the naval forces is in receipt of retired pay

a hospital or other institution.

"(4) An additional allowance may be awarded in respect of an eligible dependant at the rate and subject to the conditions which would be appropriate under Article 13 if that dependant were an eligible member of the family and the degree of the member's disablement were 100 per cent.:

(a) where that eligible dependant is a wife or a husband (whether married to the member before or after the material date) or an unmarried dependant living as a wife, the rate of the additional allowance in respect of that person may be increased to the rate of £42 a year in the case of an officer, or the rate of 16s. a week in any other case, as the Minister may think fit having regard to the financial circumstances of that person;

(b) where, in the case of a member of the naval forces not being an officer, an increased allowance is granted under paragraph (3) of this Article and the amount of the allowance awarded under the foregoing provisions of this paragraph in respect of the first child is 7s. 6d. a week, a further allowance of 2s. 6d. a week may be awarded in respect of that child."

7. In proviso (b) to Article 20 (5) (which provides for the payment of additional allowances during periods of approved treatment) for the figures 23s. 6d. there shall be substituted the figures 26s.

8. In the proviso to Article 22 (which provides for the payment of allowances for part-time treatment) for the words and figures "Article 14, 15, 16 or 17 (2)" there shall be substituted the words and figures "Article 14, 15, 16, 17 (2) or 17A".

9. In Article 30 (1) (which provides for the payment of rent allowances) for the figure 8s. there shall be substituted the figure 6s.

10. Article 41 shall be deleted and there shall be substituted therefor the following Article:—

"41. Regular officers with permanent commissions.—A regular officer with a permanent commission (not being an officer to whom Article 42, 43, 44 or 45 applies) may be granted—

(a) the award, other than an award at the half pay rate, for which he is eligible under the principal Regulations in respect of service, together with a disablement addition on a pension basis or, as the case may be, a disablement addition on a gratuity basis; or

(b) for so long as it is to his advantage and in lieu of an award under subparagraph (a) of this paragraph, the appropriate award under Article 11; or

(c) where he is invalided before he has qualified for an award of retired pay under the principal Regulations, the appropriate award under Article 11 or 12 in addition to any service gratuity for which he is eligible; or

(d) the award for which he is eligible under the principal Regulations."

11. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st June, 1951, so, however, that in relation to any award payable weekly the foregoing reference to the 1st June, 1951, shall be construed as a reference to the first normal weekly pay day for that award following the 1st June, 1951.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

1. This Order amends the Order of the 29th September, 1949 as amended by the Order of the 28th October, 1949 and introduces the following changes in the pensions provisions.

2. The allowance for unemployable pensioners has been increased from 30s. to 35s. a week.

3. The allowance for the first or only child of an other rank pensioner has been increased from 7s. 6d. a week to 10s a week where the pensioner has been awarded a special allowance either on the grounds of unemployability or because, during a course of approved treatment, he is not entitled to sickness benefit under National Insurance provisions.

4. An allowance of 10s. a week for the provision

4. An allowance of 10s. a week for the provision of comforts has been introduced for certain very severely disabled pensioners.

5. The number of widows who may receive rent allowances has been increased, and certain existing rent allowances have been raised, by a reduction of the qualifying rent figure from 8s. to 6s. a week.

6. The disablement pension payable to a regular officer with a permanent commission, invalided with less than ten years service, has been increased from an amount based on £150 a year for 100 per cent. disablement to an amount based on £210 a year for 100 per cent. disablement with additions according to rank.

WHEREAS by Section 659 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 & 58 Vict. c. 60), (which is a section in Part XI of that Act) it is (amongst other things) enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council fix the establishments to be maintained by each of the General Lighthouse Authorities on account of the services of lighthouses, buoys and beacons, or the annual or other sums to be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund in respect of those establishments and that an increase of any establishment or part of an establishment so fixed shall not be made without the consent of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by Section 738 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is (amongst other things) enacted that where His Majesty has power under that Act or any Act thereafter to be passed amending the same

any Act thereafter to be passed amending the same to make an Order in Council, His Majesty may from time to time make that Order in Council and by Order in Council revoke, alter or add to any Order so made:

so made:

And whereas by Section I of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898 (61 & 62 Vict. c. 44), it is (amongst other things) provided that references in Part XI of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to the Mercantile Marine Fund shall be construed as references to the General Lighthouse Fund by the now reciting Act constituted:

And whereas by the Orders in Council specified in the First Schedule hereto made in exercise of the above recited powers the establishment to be maintained by the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses (hereinafter referred to as "the Commissioners") being one of the General Lighthouse Authorities referred to in the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and the salaries to be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund in respect of that establishment were duly fixed: fixed:

And whereas the functions exercisable by the Board of Trade in relation to the matters aforesaid are now vested in the Minister of Transport: And

And whereas it is expedient that the Establishment of the Commissioners should be re-organised and

increased in manner hereinafter appearing:
And whereas it has been made to appear to His
Majesty that the Minister of Transport has consented

to such increase:

Now therefore, His Majesty in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him as aforesaid and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf and by and with the advice of His Privy Council doth order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Lighthouse Board (Establishment) Order, 1951, and shall come into operation on the date of publication in the London Gazette.

2. The Orders in Council specified in the First Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

3. Subject to the provisions of this Order the clerical and engineering establishments of the Commissioners shall consist of the posts enumerated in the Second Schedule hereto at the salaries of which the minimum, the annual increase and maximum are respectively mentioned in the same Schedule.

the minimum, the annual increase and maximum are respectively mentioned in the same Schedule.

4. The staff at present employed by the Commissioners shall, subject to individual fitness, be absorbed as far as possible into the re-organised clerical and engineering establishments under such terms as may be agreed upon by the Commissioners and the Minister of Transport but in no case shall such terms be better than those given to Civil Servants under similar conditions Servants under similar conditions.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in Part I of the Second Schedule hereto the salary of Mr. J. Glencorse Wakelin, C.B.E., at present Secretary, shall be £1,950 per annum, and the said salary may be paid to him as from the 1st October, 1950.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in Part II of the Second Schedule hereto the salary of Mr. John D. Gardner, at present Senior Engineer, shall be

D. Gardner, at present Senior Engineer, shall be £1,710 per annum up to the 31st July, 1951, and thereafter shall be £1,750 per annum, and the said salary may be paid to him as from the 1st October, 1950

7. The number of Clerical Officers at present serving on the clerical establishment of the Commissioners together with the number of officers appointed to the post of Shorthand Typist shall not in the aggregate exceed the total number of posts of Clerical Officer and Shorthand Typist provided for in the establishment.

8. All persons appointed in future to the Executive, Clerical, Shorthand Typist or Copying Typist grade on the establishment of the Commissioners shall subject to the provisions of Article 9 hereof previously to their appointment pass an examination which shall be held under conditions similar to those for candidates sitting for examinations for similar posts in the Civil Service or be nominated in a manner similar to that in which candidates for similar manner similar to that in which candidates for similar posts in the Civil Service may be nominated in accordance with any Regulations for the time being in force for Civil Servants.

9. All officers appointed to posts on the re-organised establishments fixed by this Order shall be governed by conditions of service, including pro-motion and superannuation benefits, similar to those governing Civil Servants of the corresponding grades.

10. Any officer who may be appointed to a post of a technical character or superior to a higher grade executive post on the re-organised establishments of the Commissioners as fixed by this Order may in exceptional cases and with the approval of the Minister of Transport be granted a commencing salary exceeding the minimum, but in no case exceeding the maximum salary of such post as fixed by this Order.

11. The salaries payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund.

12. The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
