

MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT.

TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.

SPECIAL ROADS ACT, 1949.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 14 of the Special Roads Act, 1949, the effect of which is to provide for the construction by the Minister of a new road at Staverton Cross Roads, Daventry, in the County of Northampton to connect Warwick Street with the London—Holyhead Trunk Road and for the stopping up of those parts of Warwick Street to be superseded thereby.

Copies of the Order and of the plan referred to therein have been deposited at the Ministry of Transport, Berkeley Square House, London, W.1, and at the offices of the Northamptonshire County Council, County Hall, Northampton, and may be seen at all reasonable hours.

Copies of the Order, the short title of which is The London—Holyhead Trunk Road (Staverton Cross Roads, Daventry, Improvements) Order, 1951, can be obtained from the Ministry of Transport, Stationery Section, Berkeley Square House, London, W.1.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Special Roads Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks of the 15th day of June, 1951, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

THE MONEY ORDER AMENDMENT (No. 2) WARRANT, 1951.
