THE INLAND POST AMENDMENT (No. 5) WARRANT, 1951.

His Majesty's Postmaster General hereby gives notice that, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2 and 82 of the Post Office Act, 1908, and section 7 of the Post Office (Amendment) Act 1935 a Warrant dated the 11th day of June 1951 and coming into operation on the 1st day of July 1951, has been made, on his representation, by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, relating to the fees payable on cash on delivery packets and to the renewal of void trade charge money orders.

MINISTRY OF FOOD

PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS, 1937 AND 1948

The Minister of Food gives notice, in pursuance of the above-named Regulations, that he hereby recognises the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as showing (a) that the meat from which the meat product to which the Certificate relates was prepared, was derived from animals inspected ante and post mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Minister and (b) that all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health were taken in the preparing and packing of the meat product.

The Certificate being in the form of a label or stamp, recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to, or the stamp is clearly impressed on, the package containing the meat product and the label or stamp has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.

REPUBLIC OF PORTUGAL

For canned meat products and other cooked meat products, a label or stamp having on it the following design:—



The Certificate will be completed by the insertion of the number of the factory and by the signature of the Chief of the Animal Health and Hygiene Department or his deputy.

Lake District National Park (Designation) Order, 1951.

The Order became operative as from the 9th day of May, 1951, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
