**WYCOMBE AND DISTRICT JOINT WATER
BOARD ORDER.**

NOTICE is hereby given that application is proposed to be made to the Minister of Local Government and Planning by the High Wycombe Borough Council and the Wycombe Rural District Council for an Order under Section 9 of the Water Act, 1945, amended by Sections 2 and 4 of the Water Act, 1948.
