On the 22nd of November 1950, a commercial ship the s.s. "Eastern Med" was loading a consignment of 900 tons, made up of 40,000 jerry-cans, of M.T. 70 at No. 3 Berth, Deep Water Berth, the Military Docks, Adabiya.

At 08.50 hours a petrol fire broke out on board the ship. During the course of Fire Fighting the vessel broke away at the forward end and drifted away from the quay due to the strong wind. W.O. II Phillips was requested to try and make fast a line to the anchor chain and then winch the ship back to the quay. By this time, the heat from the burning ship was terrific. Explosions were occurring all the time which threw jerry-cans of burning petrol some 20 feet out of the ship's hold and overside. There was serious risk of a major explosion.

W.O. II Phillips with complete disregard for his own safety and the risk of explosion carried out the request made to him. He rowed out to the ship, made fast a line to the anchor chain and brought it ashore. It was entirely due to his magnificent courage that the ship was brought back alongside the quay which allowed the fire to be fought and finally brought under control.
