"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Ramsey; Saint Mary, Ramsey; and Saint Thomas, Ponds Bridge, all in the diocese of Ely.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

And whereas the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of Ely, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Ramsey; Saint Mary, Ramsey; and Saint Thomas, Ponds Bridge, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"I. The territory (coloured pink on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Saint Mary, Ramsey:—

"All that portion of the parish of Ramsey which is bounded on the north west partly by the parish of Saint Thomas, Ponds Bridge, and partly by the parish of Saint Mary, Ramsey, on part of the south by the last mentioned parish and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of the River Nene upon the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Mary, Ramsey, from the parish of Ramsey and extending thence generally north eastwards along the middle of the said River Nene to the centre of Bodsey Bridge in the middle of Oilmills Road and continuing thence north westwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to the boundary which divides the parish of Ramsey from the "All that portion of the parish of Ramsey which which divides the parish of Ramsey from the parish of Saint Thomas, Ponds Bridge.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 13th July, 1951, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £250,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 16th July, 1951, to Saturday, the 21st July, 1951, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post, on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft. such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs presents for publication in the London Gazette the subjoined amended Foreign Service Regulations Numbers 1 and 3 of Chapters II, III, IV and V and Number 7 of Chapter IV.

These Regulations, which supersede those published in the London Gazette on the 14th January, 1947, 20th June 1947, 8th August 1947, and 20th

lished in the London Gazette on the 14th January, 1947, 20th June, 1947, 8th August, 1947, and 20th February, 1948, as amended in the London Gazette on the 24th May, 1949, are made under Article 6 of Foreign Service Order-in-Council, 1943, which was made on the 20th May, 1943, and which empowers the Foreign Secretary to make regulations for the Foreign Service from time to time.

# CHAPTER II.

# REGULATION No. 1.

Grades and Salaries.

1. The grades and salaries of members of Branch A of the Foreign Service are as follows:—
Grade 1. £4,500.
Grade 2. £3,250.
Grade 3. £2,850.
Grade 4. £2,500.

Grade 4. £2,500.
Grade 5. £2,000.
Grade 6. £1,500 rising by annual increments of £75 to £1,800 and thence by annual increments of £100 to £2,000 (men); £1,340 rising by annual increments of £75 to £1,640 and thence by annual increments of £100 to £1,850 (women).

Grade 7. £1,000 rising by annual increments of £40 to £1,200 and thence by annual increments of £50 to £1,375 (men); £880 rising by annual increments of £40 to £1,200 (women).

Grade 8. £615 rising by annual increments of £30 to £750 (men); £575 rising by annual increments of £25 to £650 (women).

Grade 9. £400 rising by annual increments of £25 to £450 and thence by annual increments of £30 to £560 (men). A special increment of £50 within the scale will be payable on completion of 3 years' probation. £400 rising by annual increments of £25 to £550 (women). A special increment of £50 within the scale will be payable on completion of 3 years' probation. completion of 3 years' probation.

The salaries of officers in Grades 1 to 4 are at revised rates which will be introduced by stages from the 1st October, 1950, to the 30th September, 1951.

Grade 1 will consist of the Permanent Under-Secretary of State and the Heads of the major Missions.

Grade 2 will consist of the Political Deputy Under-Secretary of State, the Heads of the other leading Missions and the Legal Adviser.

Grade 3 will include certain Heads of Missions

Grade 3 will include certain Heads of Missions and other Deputy Under-Secretaries of State.

Grade 4 will include Assistant Under-Secretaries of State in the Foreign Office, the Heads of certain Missions, the Minister (Deputy Head) at certain major Missions and the holders of the most important commercial-diplomatic, consular and oriental secretaries' and inspactors' posts.

Missions, the Minister (Deputy Head) at certain major Missions and the holders of the most important commercial-diplomatic, consular and oriental secretaries' and inspectors' posts.

Grade 5 will consist of Heads of some minor Missions, of the holders of other important commercial-diplomatic, consular and oriental secretaries' posts, of other inspectors' and Minister-Counsellors' posts and the Second Legal Adviser.

Grade 6 will include Heads of other minor Missions, Counsellors, the majority of Consuls-General and the Third Legal Adviser.

Grade 7 will consist of First Secretaries, Consuls and the Assistant Legal Advisers (the lastnamed are on a salary scale of £1,150-£1,500).

Grade 8 will consist of Second Secretaries and Senior Vice-Consuls.

Grade 9 will consist of persons who, after receiving a certificate of qualification from the Civil Service Commissioners, are appointed to the Foreign Service to serve as Third Secretaries or Vice-Consuls. Subject to satisfactory service, promotion from Grade 9 to Grade 8 will take place five years from passing the entrance examination into Branch A of the Foreign Service. This five years from passing the entrance examination into Branch A of the Foreign Service. This period may be reduced for members of the Foreign Service who have already served in Branch B.

2. Any officer who is called upon to assume the full duties of a post higher than his own, either at his own or at another station, may, after a continuous period of 61 days, be granted an allowance for performing such duties. Where the higher post is vacant, that is, where the salary of the post is not being paid to any other person, the allowance may be paid immediately the officer assumes the higher duties

The allowance will be calculated so as to bring the salary of the officer up to the amount which he would receive if he were promoted to the grade in which he is acting.

## Comment :

It does not follow that an officer assuming higher duties will always receive an allowance, the payment of which will depend on his ability to assume the full duties of the post.

3. If a Head of Mission, being under the age of 60, is recalled from his post on the rupture of diplomatic relations, or in other special circumdiplomatic relations, or in other special circumstances, and if he is not appointed to another post, he may, at the discretion of the Secretary of State, and provided that it is the intention to re-employ him in his existing grade or in a higher grade, continue to receive the full salary attaching to the post which he has just vacated, for a period not exceeding twelve months, after which the position will be reviewed. During this period of twelve months he will be required to perform such duties as may be assigned to him by the Secretary of State. If during this period he declines to proceed to any vacant post in which the Secretary of State is prepared to employ him, he will immediately be placed en disponibilité without salary or pension rights in respect of the period while still unemployed.

# CHAPTER II. REGULATION No. 3. Foreign Allowances.

1. A foregin allowance, or in the case of Heads of Diplomatic Missions frais de représentation, will be assigned to officers of Branch A serving abroad.

Comment:

(1) Salary is intended to cover necessary expenditure in the United Kingdom and to take the first strain of the cost of living of the officer abroad, foreign allowances supplementing it to the extent to which the salary falls short of total necessary expenditure. In assessing foreign allowances the following items inter alia are taken into necessary expenditure. In assessing foreign allowances, the following items inter alia are taken into account; (a) local cost of living; (b) expenditure which an officer serving abroad necessarily incurs, either at home or abroad, over and above that of an officer of corresponding grade serving in the Foreign Office; and (c) representational expenditure, i.e., expenditure which, while optional for a private individual, is obligatory for a member of the Foreign Service resident abroad by virtue of his official position.

(2) Foreign allowance is not subject to United

(2) Foreign allowance is not subject to United Kingdom income tax.

- 2. The amount of a foreign allowance to be assigned to an officer will be determined by the Secretary of State in the light of the conditions at the particular post.
- 3. When an officer to whom a foreign allowance is assigned is absent from his post abroad, the foreign allowance will be paid on the basis specified in paragraphs 4-8 of this regulation.

  4. When an officer who is to return to his station after his absence is—

Absent on Duty

(a) In the United Kingdom.

He will retain the foreign allowance of his post, less 12½ per cent, and draw subsistence allowance at the rates in force for the United Kingdom.

Comment:

In the case of a married officer who takes his wife and family (if any) with him, he will draw subsistence allowance for himself only. The position will be reviewed after two months' absence. The officer will be responsible for the travelling expenses of his wife and family.

(b) Temporarily attached to another station.

He will retain the whole of the foreign allowance of his own post or draw that of the temporary post, whichever is the higher, and subsistence allowance at the discretion of the Secretary of State. Where approval is given for his wife to accompany him officially, he may also draw subsistence allowance for his wife at the discretion of the Secretary of State.

(c) In circumstances other than (a) and (b).

He will retain the foreign allowance of his post, less 12½ per cent., and draw subsistence allowance. When an officer is married and approval is given for his wife to accompany him officially, he may draw subsistence allowance for his wife.

(ii) Absent on Earned Leave

iHe will draw no subsistence allowance but will retain the foreign allowance of his post, less 12½ per cent.

(iii) Absent on Sick Leave outside the Country where

(iii) Absent on Sick Leave outside the Country where he is posted

If the officer is married, and takes his wife and family (iff any) with him or if he is unmarried he will retain the foreign allowance of his post less one-third, for such period as the Secretary of State considers reasonable in the circumstances. At the end of such period the Secretary of State will exercise full discretion with regard to the further payment of foreign allowance. If the officer is married and leaves his wife and family (if any) at his station, his case will be dealt with on its merits. station, his case will be dealt with on its merits.

5. The reductions under paragraphs 4 (i) (a) and 4 (i) (c) above will not be applied in respect of brief absences on duty within a total of 14 days in one calendar year. The reduction under paragraph 4 (ii) will not be applied in respect of brief absences on leave within a total of 14 days in one calendar year.

The reduction under paragraph 4 (i) (c) will not be applied to a Head of Mission who is absent from his station but on duty within the country to which he is accredited nor will it be applied to a head of a consular post who is away from his station but on duty within his consular district.

6. When an officer who is not returning to his post after his absence is—

- 7. When a married officer, who is not returning to his station, is absent on temporary duty or on earned leave but leaves his wife and family (if any) at his station the case will be dealt with on its
- 8. An officer, married or unmarried, who is on sick leave in the country where he is posted will retain his foreign allowance, less 12½ per cent., for two months. Thereafter he will receive two-thirds of the full allowance for such period as the Secretary of State considers reasonable in the circumstances.
- 9. An officer who is called upon to assume the full duties of a higher post at his own station will receive an allowance equivalent to 12½ per cent. of the foreign allowance of an officer of his own marital status of the grade of the higher post, always provided that the officer's own foreign allowance together with the acting allowance shall not exceed the foreign allowance of the grade for which he is acting
- 10. The additional foreign allowance referred to in paragraph 9 above will not be payable to any officer substituting for an officer absent on duty or leave and in receipt of his full foreign allowance under paragraph 5 above.
- 11. An officer who is called upon to assume the full duties of a higher post at another station will receive the foreign allowance of that higher post.
- receive the foreign allowance of that higher post.

  12. Subject to a deduction of 12½ per cent to be granted to the Chargé d'Affaires as provided in paragraph 13 of this Regulation, the Head of a Diplomatic Mission will continue to receive his frais de représentation in full during absences on authorised leave or on duty outside the country to which he is accredited on the condition that he continues to defray the expenses of the upkeep of the Mission during his absence. On the expiry of his authorised leave, if he is still absent from his post, the extent of any further deduction will be deterthe extent of any further deduction will be deter-mined by the Secretary of State.
- 13. When an officer acts as Chargé d'Affaires at a Diplomatic Mission during the absence of the Head of Mission he will draw, in addition to his own foreign allowance, an allowance equivalent to 12½ per cent. of the frais de représentation of the absent Head of Mission to enable him to met the additional cost of entertainment.

Grade 3 will consist of officers who perform responsible duties in certain Departments of the Foreign Office or at Missions abroad, take charge of certain Consulates or act as second-in-charge at certain Consulates-General.

Grade 4 will consist of officers who perform general duties in the Foreign Office or at Missions abroad or who act as Vice-Consuls.

Grade 5 will consist of officers who perform general duties in the Foreign Office or when serving abroad who act as Archivists, Accountants, &c., at Missions or as senior clerks in Consular offices.

Grade 5A. Officers of this grade will be few in number and will mainly be employed in the super-

## Language Allowances.

A language allowance of 10s. 0d. a week for full-time use of the language, or 6s. 0d. a week for occasional use of the language, will be payable to any officer of Grade 1 of Branch C of the Foreign Service who is certified by the Civil Service Commission to have passed an examination in, and to possess a competent knowledge, colloquial or otherwise, of the language (other than English) of the country in which the officer is currently serving.

2. These allowances will be subject to Income

Tax.

Comment :

(1) In certain cases, where knowledge of the language is certified as essential, tuition fees on a reasonable scale may be allowed for the following languages:-

German. Italian.

Portuguese. Spanish.

Should an officer resign before the end of the tour of duty in respect of which tuition fees have been paid, the Secretary of State may, at his discretion, call upon her to refund the fees in question.

(2) An officer may, at any time, receive only ne allowance under the provisions of this regulation.

(3) As a general rule, an allowance is payable only where the language concerned is an official language of the country.

(4) Examinations, which will be of the same standard as those for members of Branch B of the Foreign Service, will be held abroad and in London, as necessary, not more than once in donon, as necessary, not more than once in six months at the request of officers who wish to compete. No officer will be permitted to take part in an examination unless the Foreign Office is satisfied that she is required to make use of her knowledge of the language in her official duties duties.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT FROM CANDIDATES WITH REGULAR SERVICE IN H.M. FORCES TO GRADE 6 POSTS IN BRANCH B OF THE FOREIGN SERVICE.

1. No candidate may compete more than twice under these or similar Regulations.

2. Age

Candidates must be under 50 years of age on the 1st November, 1951.

Sex.

Candidates may be of either sex, except that married women are not eligible. A woman member of Branch B must resign her appointment on marriage. 4. Nationality.

(1) Every candidate must

(a) be a natural-born British subject; and

- (b) have been born within the United Kingdom or within one of the self-governing Dominions of parents both of whom were also born within United Kingdom or within one of the selfgoverning Dominions.
- (2) No departure from this rule will be made with-out the special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and then only in exceptional cases and in favour of candidates who are British subjects and who also satisfy one of the following conditions:
  - (a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing, or residence or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

5. Service.

(i) All candidates must either

(a) have completed, or on 1st November, 1951, be within one year of completing, a period of not less than three years' continuous full-time service in H.M. Armed Forces of which not less than one year must have been whole-time voluntary service entered into for a fixed period (including in the case of officers a permanent commission); or

(b) have contracted to complete a fixed period of whole-time voluntary service (including in the case of officers a permanent commission) which would have qualified under (a) and been invalided before completing that period.

(ii) No candidate will be eligible whose whole-time service ceased more than two years before the 1st November, 1951.

Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

7. Examination.

The candidates will undergo a written examination consisting of papers in English and Arithmetic, General Paper, and a test of General Intelligence.

Candidates will be arranged in order of merit on their aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole, but before any candidate can be appointed, he or she will be required to establish, in an interview at the Foreign Office, that he or she has the ability to learn languages and is in other respects suitable for appointment to the Foreign Service. Even if there are unfilled vacancies, no candidate will be if there are unfilled vacancies, no candidate will be appointed who does not obtain an aggregate which satisfies the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. Candidates Trained as Teachers.
