At the Court at Windsor, the 29th day of June, 1951.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of June, 1951, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and the Acts mentioned therein, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of a part or share of and in the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the churches and cure (hereinafter called ‘the said benefice’) of North Owersby with Thornton le Moor in the County and diocese of Lincoln.

“ Whereas we are satisfied that Annie Maria Boynton of ‘Thornhayes’ Sleaford in the County of Lincoln, widow, is entitled to one-third part or share of and in the advowson of the said benefice:

“ And whereas the said Annie Maria Boynton desires to transfer her share in the rights of patronage in respect of the said benefice to the Bishop of Lincoln for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof she has executed the same):

“ And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Maurice, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole interest of the said Annie Maria Boynton in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Maurice, Bishop of Lincoln, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Lincoln for the time being.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lincoln.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of June, 1951, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Ramsey; Saint Mary, Ramsey; and Saint Thomas, Ponds Bridge, all in the diocese of Ely.

“ Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of Ely, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

“ Now, therefore, we the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Ramsey; Saint Mary, Ramsey; and Saint Thomas, Ponds Bridge, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

“ THE SCHEDULE

“ I. The territory (coloured pink on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Saint Mary, Ramsey:—

“ All that portion of the parish of Ramsey which is bounded on the north west partly by the parish of Saint Thomas, Ponds Bridge, and partly by the parish of Saint Mary, Ramsey, on part of the south by the last mentioned parish and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of the River Nene upon the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Mary, Ramsey, from the parish of Ramsey and extending thence generally north eastwards along the middle of the said River Nene to the centre of Bodsey Bridge in the middle of Oilmills Road and continuing thence north westwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to the boundary which divides the parish of Ramsey from the parish of Saint Thomas, Ponds Bridge.

“ II. The territory (coloured green on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Saint Thomas, Ponds Bridge:—

“ All that portion of the parish of Ramsey which is bounded on the north west by the parish of Saint Thomas, Ponds Bridge, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point where the last mentioned boundary meets the Urban and Rural District Council boundary in the middle of
