"2. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery* :

"The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Middlesex and in the rural deanery of Uxbridge.

"All that part of the parish of Saint James, Enfield, which is bounded upon the east by the parish of Waltham, Holy Cross, upon the north by the parish of Holy Trinity, Waltham Cross, both of which parishes are in the diocese of Chelmsford, upon the west by the parish of Saint George, Enfield, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint George, Enfield, from the parish of Saint James, Enfield, opposite to the middle of the northern end of the track or footpath which runs from north to south upon the western side of Albany Park, and extending thence southwards along the middle of the said track or footpath to a point opposite to the middle of its southern end in the middle of Bell Lane and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of Bell Lane to a point opposite to the northern end of the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises on the western side of Meadow Close and continuing thence firstly southwards to and along the said walls or fences and then eastwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises at the southern end of Meadow Close and then southwards again along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Nos. 75 to 57 (odd) Redlands Road to their end upon the northern side of The Brightside and continuing thence in a straight line across The Brightside to the northern end of the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as No. 55, Redlands Road and continuing thence generally southwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear of the remaining houses and premises on the western side of Redlands Road to a point where the last-mentioned walls or fences meet the western end of the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949 and of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Mervyn, Bishop of Winchester (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Saint Mary Bourne and the benefice of Litchfield both situate in the diocese of Winchester.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices*. The benefice of Saint Mary Bourne and the benefice of Litchfield shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Saint Mary Bourne with Litchfield' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union*. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Michael Wilson, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Mary Bourne shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House*. Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Saint Mary Bourne shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Litchfield and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of

such sale shall be paid by us to the diocesan board of finance of the said diocese to be held by the said board for the purpose of applying the interest thereon in augmentation of the fund referred to in Clause 5 hereof.

"4. *Patronage.* With the consent (testified by his signature hereto) of Hugh David Hamilton Wills, of The Manor House, Litchfield, in the County of Southampton, a major in Your Majesty's Army, being the patron of the benefice of Litchfield, and with the consent (testified as aforesaid) of the Right Reverend Mervyn, Bishop of Winchester, being the patron of the benefice of Saint Mary Bourne, the whole right of patronage in respect of the benefice of Litchfield shall without any conveyance or assurance other than this Scheme be surrendered in favour of the Right Reverend Mervyn, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors, Bishops of Winchester, to the intent that the whole patronage of the united benefice of Saint Mary Bourne with Litchfield shall belong wholly to and be exercisable by the said Bishop of Winchester and his successors."

"5. *Clerical or Lay Assistance.*

"(1) Upon the union taking effect the incumbent shall employ such clerical or lay assistance to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice as the bishop of the said diocese of Winchester may from time to time direct.

"(2) A part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely an annual sum of £50, being part of a larger annual sum at present payable by us to the incumbent for the time being of the benefice of Saint Mary Bourne, shall upon the union taking effect be paid by us to the diocesan board of finance of the said diocese of Winchester to be held by the said board as a fund towards the cost of providing such clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid."

"SCHEME

"Whereas under the provisions of an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council dated the 18th day of February, 1854, the benefice of Mareham on the Hill and the benefice of High Toynnton were united into one benefice with cure of souls with effect from the date of the said Order:

"And whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln has forwarded to us, the said Church Commissioners, provisional proposals pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, recommending that the union of the said benefices should be dissolved and that the said benefice of Mareham on the Hill should be held in plurality with the united benefice of Hameringham with Scrafield and Winceby and that the said benefice of High Toynnton should be held in plurality with the united benefice of Fulletby with Greetham, all of which benefices are in the said diocese of Lincoln:

"And whereas effect can be given to the said proposals so far as they relate to the dissolution of the said union by Scheme prepared by us and confirmed by Order of Your Majesty in Council pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures and in so far as they relate to the said pluralities by subsequent Orders made by the said Bishop pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure:
