At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 1st day of August, 1951.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 29th day of June, 1951, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parish of Saint Paul, Ruislip Manor, in the diocese of London.

"SCHEME

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend William, Bishop of London, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Constitution* :

"(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Mary, Ruislip'.

"2. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery* :

"The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Middlesex and in the rural deanery of Uxbridge.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—

"All that part of the parish of Saint Paul, Ruislip Manor, which lies to the south of the middle of Yeading Brook."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, has been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 5th day of July, 1951, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Ashington and Seaton Hirst both in the diocese of Newcastle.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Noel, Bishop of Newcastle, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Ashington and Seaton Hirst shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The territory (coloured pink on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Seaton Hirst:—

"All that portion of the parish of Ashington which is bounded upon part of the south by the parish of Cambois, upon the remaining part of the south, upon the east and north by the parish of Seaton Hirst and upon the remaining side by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said parish of Seaton Hirst from the said parish of Ashington diverges from North Seaton Road and extending thence southwards along the middle of North Seaton Road to a point on the eastern side of the Newbiggin Branch of the British Railways (North
