**EXTENSION TO CERTAIN TERRITORIES OF THE UNITED KINGDOM  
DOUBLE INCOME-TAX AGREEMENT WITH CANADA**

It has been agreed between the United Kingdom Government and the Canadian Government that the Agreement of the 5th June, 1946, between the Government of the United Kingdom and the Government of Canada for the Avoidance of Double Taxation and the Prevention of Fiscal Evasion with respect to Taxes on Income (S.R. & O. 1946 No. 1885) may be extended to apply to certain Territories.

The following letters have been exchanged between the two Governments:—

Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that my Government, in accordance with Article XV of the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom and the Government of Canada for the avoidance of double taxation and the prevention of fiscal evasion with respect to taxes on Income, dated 5th June, 1946, has instructed me to give notice of its desire that the Agreement shall extend to the Governments of certain Colonial territories which have been consulted and have expressed their wish for the extension. The names of the territories, the dates from which it is suggested the extension should have effect in relation to them, and the taxes concerned, are listed in the appendix hereto.

2. The extension, it is suggested, shall have effect in Canada as respects income taxes, including surtaxes, for the taxation year 1951 and, subsequent years.

3. In relation to the territories listed in the Appendix, Article VI (3) of the Agreement will require modification as follows. For "shall be exempt from [United Kingdom] surtax" there shall be deemed to be substituted "shall not be liable to tax in [the territory] at a rate in excess of the rate applicable to a company".

4. It is proposed that this notification and the Canadian Government's written acceptance shall be regarded as putting on record the agreement of the two Governments that the Double Taxation Agreement as modified shall apply to the territories named on the sixtieth day after the date below.

5. Subject to the concurrence of the Canadian Government it is proposed that this exchange of documents shall be published in the London Gazette and an announcement issued to the United Kingdom press. It is assumed that suitable publicity will also be given in Canada to the extension of the Agreement.

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your Note No. 41 of July 27, 1951, regarding the income tax agreement between Canada and the United Kingdom which reads as follows:—

*[Here follows text of letter from the High Commissioner for the United Kingdom dated 27th July, 1951]*

2. The terms of the foregoing note are acceptable to the Canadian Government and I have the honour to confirm that the note under reference together with my present reply thereto shall be regarded as putting on record the agreement of the two Governments that the Double Taxation Agreement as modified shall apply to the territories named on the sixtieth day after July 27, 1951.

3. I am also in a position to inform you that the Canadian Government has no objection to the publication of this exchange of documents in the London Gazette and to the release of an appropriate announcement to the United Kingdom Press. The Canadian authorities, for their part, propose to have the present exchange of notes published in the Canada Gazette and to issue a brief statement to the Canadian press.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

RECRUITMENT OF (A) H.M. INSPECTORS OF TAXES IN THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT, (B) THE CADET GRADE IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL SERVICE, (C) PROBATIONARY ASSISTANT POSTAL CONTROLLERS IN THE POST OFFICE, AND (D) JOINT INTELLIGENCE BUREAU OFFICER, GRADE III, MINISTRY OF DEFENCE.

1. There will be two methods of entry: Method I and Method II. Regulation 2 relates to Method I, and Regulations 3 and 4 to Method II; the remaining Regulations relate to both methods. No candidate may compete more than twice in all under Normal and Reconstruction Regulations; but if he competes under both Method I and Method II in the same year this will be treated as a single attempt.

## METHOD I.

## 2. Examination.

(i) The examination consists of the following:—

(A) A written examination, comprising

(a) three compulsory subjects, namely Essay, English, and Present Day, to each of which a maximum of 100 marks is allotted;

(b) a selection from the optional subjects set out in the Appendix. Subject to the provisions in the Appendix, candidates may take optional subjects up to a total of 500 marks (the marks awarded on these optional subjects will be adjusted to a maximum of 700 marks, making 1,000 marks in all for the written examination).

(B) An interview before the Final Interview Board, which will award a mark out of a maximum of 300 for the candidate's record, intelligence, and personal qualities.

(ii) The final order of merit will be determined by the total marks gained in the whole examination. In the event of a tie between two or more candidates, the Commissioners will decide which to declare successful.

## METHOD II.

## 3. Examination.

(i) The examination consists of the following:—

(A) A written examination consisting of two papers in English, two General Papers, and a test of General Intelligence, for each of which a maximum of 100 marks is allotted (making 500 marks in all).

(B) A series of tests of personal qualities.

(C) An interview before the Final Selection Board.

(ii) The Commissioners will select in the light of the results of the written examination under (i) (A) and of the candidates' records those who will be admitted to the series of tests of personal qualities under (i) (B).

(iii) The Commissioners will subsequently select in the light of the candidates' performances in the series of personal tests and of their records those who will be admitted to interview by the Final Selection Board.

(iv) The final order of merit will be determined by the mark awarded by the Final Selection Board out of a maximum of 300. This will take into account the candidate's record, intelligence, and personal qualities. In the event of a tie between two or more candidates the Commissioners will decide which to declare successful. The Commissioners may at their discretion require a candidate to attend a second time before the Final Selection Board if they consider it necessary to enable them to reach a decision.

(v) The Commissioners may, at their discretion, exempt from the written examination under (i) (A) any one who has previously been a candidate under Method II either for the Administrative Class of the Home Civil Service or for the Special Departmental Classes and has been awarded a mark of more than 200 by the Final Selection Board, provided he applies for such exemption when making application for entry to the Competition.

## 4. Education.

(i) Candidates must either (a) have obtained a degree at a recognised University, or (b) be in the last year of a course for a degree at a recognised University. In the latter case, they will not be declared successful unless they can produce evidence, not later than 1st September of the year in which they compete, that they have obtained the degree.

(ii) A candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may be admitted to compete, notwithstanding that he fails to satisfy the requirements of sub-para. (i), if (a) he is in other respects eligible under these Regulations to compete; and (b) he is recommended to the Civil Service Commissioners by the appropriate Service Authority, as warranting consideration for appointment to the Special Departmental Classes by reason of his record, education, intelligence, and personal qualities.

## METHODS I AND II.

## 5. Age.

Candidates must be at least 20½ years and under 24 years of age on the 1st August of the year in which the examination is held. But

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age;

(b) a candidate who has served in H.M. Forces otherwise than on a regular engagement may deduct the period of such service from his actual age, up to a maximum of two years;

(c) for Method II only, candidates who are 24 years and over but under 30 years of age on 1st August of the year in which the examination is held may at the Commissioners' discretion be admitted to the competition for posts in the Ministry of Labour and National Service, provided that they are in all other respects eligible under these Regulations, and that they have had experience in employment in industry or social work which particularly fits them for consideration for appointment to posts in the Ministry of Labour and National Service.

#### 6. Sex.

Both men and women are eligible, except that posts of Probationary Assistant Postal Controller are open to men only.

#### 7. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject, or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing, or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

#### 8. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

#### 9. Vacancies.

The number of vacancies to be filled from the competition as a whole, and the number to be filled by Method I and Method II respectively, will be determined by the Commissioners.

#### 10. Candidates Trained as Teachers.

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

#### 11. Assignment.

Persons who apply under these Regulations will be regarded as candidates for all the situations concerned for which they are eligible under these Regulations; they will, however, be required to state on their application forms their preferences between these situations. The Commissioners will decide to which Department each candidate is to be assigned. A candidate who declines to accept the post offered will have no claim to be assigned to another, but will be regarded as having declined appointment. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service, but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account.

A candidate cannot be considered for appointment as J.L.B. Officer, Grade III, in the Ministry of Defence, unless (a) as a Method I candidate he includes in his optional subjects one or more of the following:—(26) General Economics, (27) Industry and Trade, (30) Social Economics, (31) Economic History, (32) Economic Statistics, (43) and (44) Geology, (50) Geography, or (b) as a Method II candidate his degree is in economic subjects, geology, or geography.

#### 12. Canvassing.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

#### 13. Fees.

The fee payable by all candidates is 15s. for each Method. A candidate who applies to compete by both Methods must pay £1 10s. The appropriate fee must be sent with the application form.

2. Candidates may take optional subjects up to a total of 500 marks. A candidate who wishes to offer subjects the aggregate value of which exceeds 500 marks must name a subject to be valued on a reduced maximum in order to bring the aggregate to 500. This option cannot be exercised by a candidate who can reduce his aggregate to 500 by omitting one or more of the subjects he proposes to offer.

3. The following restrictions apply to particular optional subjects.

(a) International Relations (25) may not be taken by a candidate who offers European History, Period 3 (8), or International Law (14).

(b) Greek Literature (60) may be taken only by candidates who offer Greek Translation (57), and Latin Literature (64) only by those who offer Latin Translation (61).

(c) A candidate who offers one or more of the subjects French History (68), German History (71), Spanish or Italian History (74), Russian History (77), may not offer either subject 7 (European History, Period 1 or Period 2), or subject 8 (European History, Period 3).

4. A candidate desiring to offer Experimental Psychology (22) or any of the subjects 37 to 48 must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of laboratory training of University standard. For Astronomy (36), Engineering (49), Geography (50), and the Physical Anthropology branch of Special Anthropology (52), other equivalent training will be required. There will be no laboratory test as part of the examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competition will be held in 1952 under the above Regulations. For Method I the written examination will be held in July, 1952, and that for Method II in January, 1952.

No person will be admitted to the competition from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, by 30th November, 1951, for Method II, and 28th February, 1952, for Method I, an application on the prescribed form which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

1. No candidate may compete more than twice in all under Normal and Reconstruction Regulations.

2. *Age.*

Candidates must be at least 20½ years and under 24 years of age on the 1st August of the year in which the examination is held. But

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age;

(b) a candidate who has served in H.M. Forces otherwise than on a regular engagement may deduct the period of such service from his actual age, up to a maximum of two years.

3. *Sex.*

Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

4. *Nationality.*

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject, or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in his Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that

they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing, or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

5. *Health and Character.*

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

6. *Subjects of Examination.*

(i) The examination consists of the following:—

(A) A written examination, comprising

(a) five compulsory subjects for which a maximum of 700 marks is allotted;

2. Candidates may take optional subjects up to a total of 700 marks. A candidate who wishes to offer subjects the aggregate value of which exceeds 700 marks must name a subject to be valued on a reduced maximum in order to bring the aggregate to 700. This option cannot be exercised by candidates who can reduce their aggregate to 700 by omitting one or more of the subjects they propose to offer.

3. The following restrictions apply to particular optional subjects.

(a) International Relations (25) may not be taken by a candidate who offers European History, Period 3 (8), or International Law (14).

(b) Greek Literature (60) may be taken only by candidates who offer Greek Translation (57), and Latin Literature (64) only by those who offer Latin Translation (61).

(c) In subjects 68 to 78 the history or literature paper associated with a language may be taken only by candidates who offer the language itself for examination.

(d) A candidate who offers one or more of the subjects French History (68), German History (71), Spanish or Italian History (74), Russian History (77), may not offer either subject 7 (European History, Period 1 or Period 2), or subject 8 (European History, Period 3).

4. A candidate desiring to offer Experimental Psychology (22) or any of the subjects 37 to 48 must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of laboratory training of University standard. For Astronomy (36), Engineering (49), Geography (50), and the Physical Anthropology branch of Special Anthropology (52), other equivalent training will be required. There will be no laboratory test as part of the examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open competition will be held under the above Regulations, the written examination being held in January, 1952.

No person will be admitted to the competition from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received on or before the 30th November, 1951, an application on the prescribed form which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

**RECRUITMENT FROM UNIVERSITY GRADUATES TO THE EXECUTIVE CLASSES AND THE INFORMATION OFFICER CLASS OF THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE AND GRADE 5 POSTS IN BRANCH B OF THE FOREIGN SERVICE.**

1. No candidate may compete more than twice in the annual competitions for recruitment to the Executive Classes from University graduates.

**2. Age.**

Candidates must be at least 20½ and under 24 years of age on the 1st August of the year in which the examination is held.

But a candidate who has served in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age, up to a maximum of two years.

**3. Sex.**

(i) Both men and women are eligible, but women will not ordinarily be appointed to posts in the Admiralty, or to the Immigration Service of the Home Office.

(ii) Married women are not eligible for appointment to Branch B of the Foreign Service; a woman member of Branch B must resign her appointment on marriage.

**4. Nationality.**

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing, or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

For the Foreign Service every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, and have been born within the United Kingdom or one of the self-

governing Dominions, of parents both of whom were also born within the United Kingdom or one of the self-governing Dominions.

No departure from this rule will be made without the special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and then only in exceptional cases, and in favour of candidates who satisfy the conditions laid down above for the Home Civil Service.

**5. Education.**

Candidates must either (a) have obtained a degree at a recognised University, or (b) be in the last year of a course for a degree at a recognised University. In the latter case, they will not be declared successful unless they can produce evidence, not later than 1st September of the year in which they compete, that they have obtained their degree.

**6. Health and Character.**

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

**7. Examination.**

(i) The examination consists of the following:—

(A) A written examination comprising

(a) three compulsory subjects, namely Essay, English, and Present Day, for each of which a maximum of 100 marks is allotted, and

(b) a selection from the optional subjects set out in the Appendix. Subject to the provisions in the Appendix, candidates may take optional subjects up to a total of 500 marks (the marks awarded on these optional subjects will be adjusted to a maximum of 700 marks, making 1,000 marks in all for the written examination).

(B) An interview before the Final Interview Board, which will award a mark out of a maximum of 300 for the candidate's record, intelligence, and personal qualities.

(ii) The final order of merit will be determined by the total marks gained in the whole examination. In the event of a tie between two or more candidates, the Commissioners will decide which to declare successful.

**8. Candidates Trained as Teachers.**

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

**9. Assignment.**

The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. A candidate who declines to accept the post offered will have no claim to be assigned to another, but will be regarded as having declined appointment. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service, but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account.

In order to be eligible for assignment to Branch B of the Foreign Service candidates will be required to satisfy the Final Interview Board that they have the ability to learn languages.

**10. Fee.**

(a) A fee of 15s. is payable by all candidates. This must be sent with the Application Form.

(b) Candidates who have entered for the Special Departmental Classes by Method I in the concurrent Open Competition and have paid the prescribed fee, may enter for this Competition without further fee.
