GEORGE THE SIXTH by the Grace of God of Great Britain Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King Defender of the Faith To all Archbishops Dukes Marquesses Earls Viscounts Bishops Barons Baronets Knights Citizens and Burgesses and all other Our faithful Subjects whatsoever to whom these Presents shall come Greeting

WHEREAS by section six of an Act passed in the first year of Our Reign intituled "The Regency Act 1937" it is amongst other things enacted that in the event of Our illness We may in order to prevent delay or difficulty in the despatch of public business by Letters Patent under the Great Seal delegate for the period of that illness to Counsellors of State such of Our Royal functions as may subject to the exceptions provided in the said Act be specified in the Letters Patent AND WHEREAS by reason of Our illness We deem it expedient to delegate pursuant to the said section the Royal functions hereinafter specified AND WHEREAS the persons to whom Royal functions may by virtue of the said section as amended by an Act passed in the seventh year of Our Reign intituled "The Regency Act 1943" now be delegated by Us as Counsellors of State are Our Most dearly beloved Consort the Queen Our Most dearly beloved Daughter Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth Alexandra Mary Duchess of Edinburgh Lady of Our Most Noble Order of the Garter Lady of the Imperial Order of the Crown of India Our Most dearly beloved Daughter Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret Rose Lady of the Imperial Order of the Crown of India Our Most dear and entirely beloved Brother and Most faithful Counsellor His Royal Highness The Prince Henry William Frederick Albert Duke of Gloucester Knight of Our Most Noble Order of the Garter Knight of Our Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle Knight of Our Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick Great Master and Principal Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Honour-

able Order of the Bath Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order and Our Most dear and entirely beloved Sister Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal Victoria Alexandra Alice Mary Lady of the Imperial Order of the Crown of India Dame Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order Dame Grand Cross of Our Most Excellent Order of the British Empire KNOW YE that We do hereby by virtue of the provisions of the said Acts delegate for the period of Our illness to the said Counsellors of State that is to say to Our Consort The Queen The Princess Elizabeth Duchess of Edinburgh The Princess Margaret The Duke of Gloucester and The Princess Royal the Royal functions hereinafter specified to be exercised jointly by not less than two of their number subject to the condition that they shall not act in any matter or thing on which it is signified by Us or appears to them that Our special approval should previously be obtained and accordingly We do by these Presents delegate and grant unto the said Counsellors of State or any two of them full power and authority during the period of Our illness to summon and hold on Our behalf Our Privy Council and to signify thereat Our approval of any matter or thing to which Our approval in Council is required and further to approve and sign on Our behalf commissions for signifying the Royal Assent to Acts of Parliament except an Act touching any of the matters for which provision is made in the Act of Settlement or touching Our Royal Style and Titles and to approve and sign on Our behalf any proclamation warrant fiat submission or other document requiring Our Signature which relates to the affairs of Our United Kingdom or to the affairs of any of Our Colonies or any Territories under Our protection or in which We have jurisdiction in cases where Our Government in the United Kingdom is responsible for the foreign affairs of such Colonies or Territories and to do on Our behalf any matter or thing required to be done in relation to any such proclamation warrant fiat submission or other document and further to do on Our behalf any matter or thing which by virtue of Our Royal Prerogative or of any statutory or other

power We are authorised to do for the safety or good government of Our United Kingdom any of Our said Colonies or any of the said Territories save only that as provided in the said Act they the said Counsellors of State shall not have power to dissolve Parliament otherwise than on Our express instructions and shall not grant any rank title or dignity of the peerage and further that they shall not receive any homage required to be done to Ourselves and shall not approve and sign any warrant fiat submission or other document set out in the Schedule hereunto annexed Commanding all and singular Archbishops Dukes Marquesses Earls Viscounts Bishops Barons Baronets Knights Citizens and Burgesses and all other Our Officers Ministers and Subjects that in everything appertaining to the matters aforesaid they be attendant counselling and helping the said Counsellors of State as it behoves them

In Witness whereof We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent Witness Ourselves at Westminster the Twenty-seventh day of September in the fifteenth year of Our Reign

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the George Medal to:—

4022248 Leading Aircraftman Gerald Arthur JARRETT, Royal Air Force, Royal Air Force Station, Hullavington.

In the early hours of 29th May, 1951, a Wellington aircraft crashed and burst into flames about three miles from Royal Air Force Station, Hullavington. Leading Aircraftman Jarrett was in charge of the crash crew for that night as no N.C.O. was available. As driver of the aircraft crash rescue jeep, Jarrett was first on the scene of the accident, arriving there in a commendably short time. The aircraft was burning fiercely and pyrotechnics and oxygen bottles were exploding. Jarrett saw one of the crew alive in the midst of the wreckage. Without any protective clothing and with only two hand-held fire extinguishers, showing complete disregard for his own safety, he entered the burning wreckage and extricated this member of the crew who, unfortunately, succumbed a few minutes later from his injuries. Jarrett then went to the aid of another member of the crew in another area of the burning wreckage and gave him assistance until the arrival of the main fire fighting equipment and ambulance. After this, Jarrett continued to direct fire fighting operations

until the fires had been extinguished. Throughout the incident, L.A.C. Jarrett displayed gallantry and devotion to duty of the highest order. He showed great courage and determination in entering the burning aircraft and extricating one member of the crew entirely unassisted, and his courage is further enhanced by his action in again entering the burning wreckage and endeavouring to rescue a second member of the crew. He set an excellent example by his determination, initiative, leadership and complete disregard for his personal safety. His thorough understanding and energetic execution of his duties were beyond praise.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. 7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz. :—

RECRUITMENT OF SECOND AND THIRD CLASS VALUERS IN THE INLAND REVENUE.

1. Candidates must (save as provided below) be at least 25 and under 35 years of age on the 1st October, 1951.

But, exceptionally for the year 1951, candidates who are 35 years of age or over on that date will be eligible, without any upper age limit. In general, however, Government Departments require a reasonable period of service from persons newly appointed to the Civil Service, and accordingly the Commissioners reserve the right to give weight to this factor in considering candidates for these posts who are over 50 years of age.

2. (i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.

3. Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions :—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or,

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Candidates must have passed the Final Examination of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors, or of the Chartered Auctioneers' and Estate Agents' Institute, or of the Land Agents' Society, or hold a University Degree (e.g., B.Sc. (Estate Management) London, or B.A. (Estate Management) Cambridge) which gives exemption from the examinations of any one of these bodies. Candidates who are sitting their final examination in the summer of 1951, may submit provisional applications on the understanding that they will be declared ineligible if they fail to pass the examination. All candidates must, on the closing date for the receipt of applications, have had at least four years' professional experience before or after qualifying in:—

(a) the office of a F.R.I.C.S., F.A.I., F.L.A.S., or any Government or municipal service; or

(b) the office of any other surveyor, estate agent, or land agent which in the opinion of the Commissioners and the Department gives an adequate experience.

Time spent on agricultural subjects at a University or approved Agricultural College and followed by the obtaining of a degree or diploma may count up to two out of the required four years.

For posts involving the valuation of minerals, four years' mining experience will be required in place of the professional experience specified above, and for these posts possession of a First Class Certificate of Competency (Mine Managers) or the passing of the Final Examination of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors in the Mining sub-division will be accepted as professional qualifications.

Candidates should have some knowledge of the problems arising from subsidence in mining areas as well as of the valuation of minerals.

5. Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

6. Every candidate must apply on the appropriate form within the time and in the manner of which notice is given by the Commissioners.

7. Those candidates who appear from their application forms to have the best qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board which will recommend to the Commissioners for appointment the candidates who appear to them to be most suitable. The Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of education and experience, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview, and on their estimation of the above evidence they will frame their recommendations. When the Board recommend a candidate to a post for the valuation of minerals in England and Wales, they will recommend him for appointment as Second Class or Third Class Valuer according to his qualifications and experience. The decision of the Commissioners will be final.

8. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

9. Every successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £1 10s. before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

10. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work.
