DECLARING THE CALLING OF ANOTHER

Whereas We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to dissolve this present Parliament which stands prorogued to Tuesday, the Twenty-third day of October instant; We do, for that End, publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby dissolve the said Parliament accordingly: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are discharged from their Meeting and Attendance on the said Tuesday, the Twenty-third day of October instant: And We being desirous and resolved, as soon as may be, to meet Our People, and to have their Advice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all Our loving Subjects Our Royal Will and Pleasure to call a new Parliament: And do hereby further declare, that, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, We have given Order that Our Chancellor of Great Britain and Our Governor of Northern Ireland do respectively, upon Notice thereof, forthwith issue out Writs, in due Form and according to Law, for calling a new Parliament: And We do hereby also, by this Our Royal Proclamation under Our Great Seal of Our Realm, require Writs forthwith to be issued accordingly by Our said Chancellor and Governor respectively, for causing the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons who are to serve in the said Parliament to be duly returned to, and give their Attendance in, Our said Parliament on Wednesday the Thirty-first day of October instant which Writs are to be returned in due course of Law.

A PROCLAMATION

IN ORDER TO THE ELECTING AND SUMMONING THE  
SIXTEEN PEERS OF SCOTLAND

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS We have in Our Council thought fit to declare Our pleasure for summoning and holding a Parliament of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, on Wednesday the Thirty-first day of October instant ensuing the date hereof: In order, therefore, to the electing and

summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland who are to sit in the House of Peers in the said Parliament, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at the Palace of Holyroodhouse, in Edinburgh, on Tuesday the Twenty-third day of October instant at Twelve o'clock Noon to nominate and choose the Sixteen Peers to sit and vote in the House of Peers in the said ensuing Parliament by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent (such Proxies being Peers and producing a Mandate in Writing duly signed before Witnesses, and both the Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law); and the Lord Clerk Register or the Principal Clerk of Session or, in the absence of both these Officers from any cause, such person as may be designated for the purpose by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, is hereby required to attend such Meeting and to take the Votes of the said Peers and immediately after such Election made and duly examined to certify the names of the Sixteen Peers so elected and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the Electors, and return such Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly command and require the Lord Provost of Edinburgh, and all other the Magistrates of the said City, to take especial care to preserve the Peace thereof during the time of the said Election, and to prevent all manner of Riots, Tumults, Disorders and Violence whatsoever: And We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns of Scotland, Ten Days at least before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such Election.

##### GREENWICH HOSPITAL.

THE GREENWICH HOSPITAL (GRANT TO THE DIOCESE OF NEWCASTLE) ORDER, 1951

Made - - - - 4th October, 1951  
Laid before Parliament 4th October, 1951  
Coming into Operation 5th October, 1951

WHEREAS His Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts, 1937 and 1943, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the Twenty-seventh day of September, 1951, to delegate and grant unto Her Majesty The Queen, Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth Duchess of Edinburgh, Lady of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, C.I., Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, C.I., His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.M.B., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., and Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal, C.I., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., or any two of them, as Counsellors of State, full power and authority during the period of His Majesty's illness to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council and to signify thereat His Majesty's

approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 2nd day of August, 1951 (G.H. 434/51), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 30 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865 (28 & 29 Vict. c. 89), it is enacted that the Admiralty, with the approval of Your Majesty in Council, may make free grants of land and grants of money, for the erection of buildings and providing conveniences for places of Worship, Residence of Ministers, Education of Children, or other public purposes (so that any such grants of land do not include any right to the minerals under the land granted, or comprise more than two acres in any one Parish):

"And whereas the Lord Bishop of Newcastle has expressed his willingness, provided that a grant of five thousand four hundred pounds is made to the funds of the diocese for public purposes, such as those named in Section 30 of the said Act, thus setting free other monies under his control for augmentation of the livings, to accept transfer of the Advowsons and Rights of Presentation to the Vicarage of Alston with Garrigill, the Rectory of Bellingham, the Rectory of Falstone, the Vicarage of Humshaugh, the Rectory of Thorneyburn with Greystead, and the Rectory of Wark at present the property of Greenwich Hospital:

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer of the said benefices to the Bishop of Newcastle on the basis proposed is in the best interests of Greenwich Hospital:

"We beg humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment of a grant of five thousand four hundred pounds from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to the funds of the diocese of Newcastle."

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen and Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth, being authorized thereto by the said Letters Patent have taken the said Memorial into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

This Order may be cited as the Greenwich Hospital (Grant to the Diocese of Newcastle) Order, 1951, and shall come into operation on the 5th day of October, 1951.

THE MERCHANT SHIPPING (SAFETY CONVENTION) (HAITI) ORDER, 1951.

And whereas Her Majesty The Queen and Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth are satisfied that the Government of the Republic of Haiti has acceded to the Safety Convention:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen and Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth, being authorized thereto by the said Letters Patent, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the aforesaid Section and of all other powers in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf order as follows:—

1. It is hereby declared that the Government of the Republic of Haiti has acceded to the Safety Convention.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Safety Convention) (Haiti) Order, 1951.

And whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of September, 1951, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Francis, Bournemouth, and Saint John, Moordown, both in the diocese of Winchester, and for constituting parts of those parishes so altered together with a part of the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, in the same diocese, a new parish

" SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied (i) that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Francis, Bournemouth, and Saint John, Moordown, should be altered in the manner described in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and as delineated on the map hereto annexed and (ii) that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map would be best served by constituting it a new parish and that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the said area described in Part II of the said Schedule as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Mervyn, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony

whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Francis, Bournemouth, and Saint John, Moordown, shall be altered in the manner described in Part I of the said Schedule and as delineated on the map annexed hereto.

"2. As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister, the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"3. As from the date of the consecration of a church within the said area defined in Part II of the said Schedule approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area defined in Part II of the said Schedule shall become a new parish.

"4. The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of the Holy Epiphany, Bournemouth'.

"5. The new district (or parish) shall be in the Archdeaconry of Winchester and in the rural deanery of Bournemouth.

" THE SCHEDULE.

" PART I.

"The territory (shown by the green colour on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Saint Francis, Bournemouth:—

"All that portion of the parish of Saint John, Moordown, which lies to the east of the middle of Haverstock Road.

" PART II.

"The area comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the parishes of Saint John, Moordown and Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, and Saint Francis, Bournemouth (shown by the pink colour on the map), which, taken together, are bounded on the north-west by the parish of Saint Andrew, Kinson, on the north by the parish of Christchurch and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Moordown, from the parish of Christchurch in the middle of Muscliff Lane opposite to the middle of the southeastern end of the road leading from Muscliff Lane to Shelley Lodge and extending thence generally eastwards and along the middle of Muscliff Lane to a point opposite to the northeastern end of the footpath running southwestwards towards Castle Lane between closes numbered 528 and 526 and continuing thence first southwestwards, then southeastwards, and then again southwestwards along the last mentioned footpath to a point at the southwestern corner of close numbered 602 in the middle of the footpath leading to Littlecroft Avenue and continuing thence northwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned footpath to a point in the middle of the northeastern end of Littlecroft Avenue and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of Littlecroft Avenue to the middle of Castle Lane on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, from the parish of Saint John, Moordown, and continuing thence northwestwards along the middle of Castle Lane (thereby following the last mentioned boundary) to a point opposite to the northeastern end of Haverstock Road and continuing thence first southwards along the middle of Haverstock Road to a point where it meets the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Moordown, from the parish of Saint Francis, Bournemouth, and continuing thence first southwards and then southwestwards along the middle of Haverstock Road to a point where it again meets the last mentioned boundary and continuing thence southwestwards along the same boundary to a point in the middle of Malvern Road and continuing thence northwestwards along the middle of Malvern Road and Redhill Crescent (thereby crossing Wimborne Road and The Avenue) to a point opposite to the middle of the southeastern end of Arden Road and continuing thence to and then along the middle of Arden Road to the southeastern end of the wall or fence on the southwestern side of the house and premises

numbered 78 The Grove (thereby crossing The Grove) and continuing thence northwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and in the same straight line crossing Redhill Park and Redhill Park Drive to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Andrew, Kinson, from the parish of Saint John, Moordown."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Letters Patent:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen and Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth, being authorized thereto by the said Letters Patent, have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf ratify the said Scheme and order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And do hereby, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

**RECRUITMENT UNDER NORMAL REGULATIONS OF ARCHITECTURAL AND CIVIL ENGINEERING DRAUGHTSMEN, MECHANICAL AND ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING DRAUGHTSMEN.**

**1. Age.**

Candidates must be at least 20 and under 60 years of age on 1st January, 1951, i.e., they must have been born on or after 2nd January, 1891, and on or before 1st January, 1931.

Government Departments, however, require a reasonable period of service from persons newly appointed to the Civil Service and accordingly the Commissioners reserve the right to give weight to this factor in considering candidates for these posts who are over 50 years of age.

**2. Sex and Marriage.**

(i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.
