And whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Supplementary Scheme bearing date the 29th day of June, 1951, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Supplementary Scheme for making certain alterations in the provisions of the Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 18th day of March, 1937, and published in the London Gazette on the 26th day of that month, for effecting ultimately the unions (1) of the benefice of Mautby with the benefice of Runham (then part of the united benefice of Runham with Thrigby) and (2) of the benefice of Filby with the benefice of Thrigby (then part of the said united benefice of Runham with Thrigby), all situate in the county of Norfolk and in the diocese of Norwich:

## " SUPPLEMENTARY SCHEME.

"Whereas in accordance with the provisions of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council and in the events which have happened the said benefice of Thrigby will (but for the alterations of the said Order hereinafter recommended and proposed) be united with the said benefice of Filby upon the next avoidance of the said benefice of Filby:

"And whereas by Clause 7 of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council it was directed that upon the union of the said benefices of Filby and Thrigby taking effect a part of the total endowments of the

benefices comprised within the union should be severed or diverted from the said united benefice and be appropriated to the benefices of Griston and Hales with Heckingham, both in the said diocese of Norwich, in equal shares:

"And whereas the united benefice of Mautby with Runham and Thrigby (of which the said benefice of Thrigby is now, in accordance with certain interim provisions of the said Order, a part) is at present vacant:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, the said Church Commissioners, and it appears to us desirable (a) that the said benefices of Filby and Thrigby should forthwith be united, and (b) that Clause 7 of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council should be rescinded:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, with the consents of the Right Reverend Percy, Bishop of Norwich, of the Reverend Canon Harold Henry Peck, incumbent of the said benefice of Filby, of the Reverend Herbert Ernest King, incumbent of the said benefice of Griston, and of the Reverend Kenneth Owen Morris, incumbent of the said benefice of Hales with Heckingham (in witness whereof they have respectively signed this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council as follows, that is to say:—

"Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Supplementary Scheme is published in the London Gazette:—

"(1) the union of the said benefice of Filby and of the said benefice of Thrigby (now part of the united benefice of Mautby with Runham and Thrigby) shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Canon Harold Henry Peck shall, with his consent (testified as aforesaid), be the first incumbent of the united benefice;

"(2) the said Order of Your Majesty in Council shall be further altered by the rescission of the directions contained in Clause 7 thereof."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Supplementary Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Supplementary Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Letters Patent:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen and Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth, being authorized thereto by the said Letters Patent, have taken the said Supplementary Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf affirm the said Supplementary Scheme and order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cyril, Archbishop of York (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Stillingfleet and the benefice of Naburn both situate in the diocese of York.

"SCHEME

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Stillingfleet and the benefice of Naburn shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Stillingfleet with Naburn', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* The union shall take effect upon the vacation by the Reverend Benjamin William Crowe of the benefice of Cawood (now held by him in plurality with the benefice of Stillingfleet) and the said Reverend Benjamin William Crowe if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Stillingfleet shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage house.* (1) Upon the union taking effect the house at present under erection as a parsonage house for the benefice of Stillingfleet shall become the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice. (2) If the parsonage house now belonging to the benefice of Naburn shall not have been sold or disposed of under the Parsonages Measure, 1938, before the taking effect of the union it and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, after the union has taken effect at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient. (3) If, pursuant to the last preceding paragraph, the said parsonage house be sold by us aforesaid the net proceeds of the sale shall be applied towards the cost of provision of the house designated as aforesaid as the house of residence of the united benefice or towards discharging any loan obtained for that purpose.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Stillingfleet having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union."

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consents of the Right Reverend Alfred, Bishop of Bradford, and of the Right Reverend Thomas, Bishop of Carlisle (in witness whereof they have respectively signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Sedbergh in the diocese of Bradford and the benefice of Killington in the diocese of Carlisle.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Sedbergh and the benefice of Killington shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Sedbergh with Killington', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend John Alfred Victor Wallace if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Sedbergh shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Sedbergh shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* With the consents of the Reverend Alexander Pemberton Kirkpatrick as incumbent of the united benefice of Kirkby Lonsdale with Mansergh being the patron of the benefice of Killington and of the Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity in Cambridge, being the patrons of the benefice of Sedbergh (in testimony whereof the respective patrons have executed this Scheme) the patronage of the said benefice of Killington shall, upon the union taking effect, be surrendered to the patrons of the said benefice of Sedbergh, to the intent that the patronage of the united benefice shall belong wholly to the patrons of the said benefice of Sedbergh.

"5. *Diocese, Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.* The united benefice shall be in the diocese of Bradford, the archdeaconry of Craven and the rural deanery of Sedbergh."

"Whereas the Right Reverend Sherard Falkner Bishop of Chelmsford has requested us, the said Church Commissioners, to prepare a Scheme with respect to the See:

"And whereas we have prepared this Scheme accordingly after consultation with the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese of Chelmsford who have offered no objection thereto:

"And whereas the said Sherard Falkner Bishop of Chelmsford has approved the Scheme and in testimony of such approval has appended his signature to the Scheme:

"And whereas the Right Honourable Clement Richard Attlee, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, has signified to us his consent to the preparation and submission of the Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the endowments and property belonging to the See of Chelmsford or held in trust therefor or for the Bishop thereof are described and referred to in the Schedule hereunder written:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Commissioners recommend and propose that upon and from the first day of July, 1951, all the endowments securities and other property described and referred to in the said Schedule and all other if any the endowments belonging to or held in trust for the said Bishopric shall vest in us the said Church Commissioners pursuant to the said Measure and that we shall be entitled absolutely to the benefit rents and profit thereof upon and from that date.

"And we further recommend and propose that we shall pay to the Bishop for the time being of the See by equal quarterly instalments in respect of the quarters ended on the thirty-first day of March the thirtieth day of June and the thirtieth day of September and the thirty-first day of December in every year the first such instalment to be the full quarter's payment due for the quarter ended on the thirtieth day of September, 1951, an annual stipend comprising the sum of £2,500 out of which sum he shall defray all the expenses incurred by him in connection with the travelling required in and for the carrying out of his official duties and obligations as Bishop.

"THE SCHEDULE

"PART I

"All that Episcopal Residence or Mansion House known as Bishopscourt together with the garage and outbuildings and the garden and other the appurtenances thereto belonging and situate in the Parish of Springfield in the City of Chelmsford in the County of Essex as the same premises are delineated on the plan annexed hereto and thereon verged red.

"PART II

"(a) The annual payment of £2,978 charged upon our Common Fund by an Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 15th day of March, 1938, and duly published in the London Gazette on the 18th day of March, 1938,

"(b) The annual payment of £22 granted to the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Chelmsford by an Instrument under the Common Seal of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England dated the 7th day of April, 1938, and published in the London Gazette on the 12th day of April, 1938, and continued to his successor in the said Bishopric.

"PART III

"All that sum of £1,802.6.7 London County Three per cent. Stock (1962-67) held by us as an Episcopal Residence Fund in connection with and for the benefit of the Episcopal Residence referred to in Part I of this Schedule.

"PART IV

"All the plate pictures furniture ornaments books and other goods and chattels belonging to the Bishop of Chelmsford in right of his dignity and not in his private capacity and being in the nature of heirlooms of the See and which are described and set forth in an inventory to be deposited in the Diocesan Registry of the Diocese of Chelmsford."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Letters Patent:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen and Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth, being authorized thereto by the said Letters Patent, have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf ratify the said Scheme and order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

#### "SCHEME.

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 7th day of February, 1927, and published in the London Gazette on the 8th day of the same month it was directed that the benefice of Neenton and the benefice of Middleton Scriven should be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls but that the parishes of the said benefices should continue distinct in all respects:

"And whereas in pursuance of the said Order the union of the said benefices took effect upon the 8th day of February, 1927:

"And whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of Hereford has forwarded to us, the said Church Commissioners, provisional proposals pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, recommending that the union of the said benefices should be dissolved, that the said benefice of Neenton should be held in plurality with the benefice of Ditton Priors and that the said benefice of Middleton Scriven should be held in plurality with the benefice of Billingsley with Sidbury, all of which benefices are situate in the said diocese of Hereford:

"And whereas effect can be given to the said proposals so far as they relate to the dissolution of the said union by Scheme prepared by us and confirmed by Order of Your Majesty in Council pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures and in so far as they relate to the said pluralities by subsequent orders made by the said Bishop pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. The union of the benefice of Neenton and the benefice of Middleton Scriven in the said united benefice of Neenton with Middleton Scriven shall be dissolved and the said benefices of Neenton and Middleton Scriven shall thereupon each become a separate benefice with cure of souls within the limits of its separate parish.

"2. The disunion of the said united benefice shall take effect upon the date when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette.

"3. The endowments and property of the said united benefice shall be divided and distributed as follows, that is to say, such part of the money appropriated to the united benefice pursuant to the Tithe Act, 1936, and now held by us as will produce £172 per annum shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Neenton and all other the endowments and property of the said united benefice shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Middleton Scriven.

"4. Upon the disunion taking effect and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the right of presentation to the benefice of Neenton shall be vested in Montague William Lowry Corry of The Grange, Bembridge, Isle of Wight, a Captain in Your Majesty's Army, his heirs and assigns and the right of presentation to the benefice of Middleton Scriven shall be vested in Robert Bravery Attlee of Oxford and Cambridge University Club, Pall Mall, London, S.W.1, Esquire, his heirs and assigns."

All that part of the parish of Saint Francis, Ashton Gate, Bedminster, which is bounded upon the south by the parish of Saint Aldhelm, Bedminster, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Aldhelm, Bedminster, from the parish of Saint Francis, Ashton Gate, Bedminster, opposite to the middle

of the southeastern end of Carrington Road and continuing thence north-westwards along the middle of Carrington Road to a point opposite to the northeastern end of the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Nos. 4 to 18 inclusive Smyth Road and continuing thence south-westwards to and along the last-mentioned walls or fences and along the walls or fences at the rear of the premises known as Nos. 20 to 24 inclusive Smyth Road (thereby crossing the track or footpath which runs from Raleigh Road to Smyth Road) to a point in the middle of Drake Road opposite to the south-western end of the last-mentioned walls or fences and continuing thence southwards along the middle of Drake Road to a point opposite to the eastern end of the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as No. 1 Drake Road from houses and premises known as Nos. 26 and 28, Smyth Road, and continuing thence westwards to and along the last-mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Nos. 30 to 48 Smyth Road and continuing thence south-westwards along the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as No. 18 Duckmoor Road from the house and premises known as No. 50 Smyth Road and in the same straight line to a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Francis, Ashton Gate, Bedminster, from the parish of Saint Aldhelm, Bedminster, and continuing thence westwards along the said boundary to a point opposite to the southeastern end of the wall or fence which divides the house and premises on the south-western side of Duckmoor Road from the house and premises known as No. 52 Smyth Road and continuing thence north-westwards first to and then along the last-mentioned wall or fence and then south-westwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Nos. 52 to 74 Smyth Road and then south-eastwards along the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as 74 Smyth Road from the houses and premises on the northeastern side of Gerald Road to a point opposite its southeastern end in the middle of Smyth Road and continuing thence south-westwards along the middle of Smyth Road to a point opposite to the middle of the southeastern end of Gerald Road and continuing thence north-westwards along the middle of Gerald Road to a point opposite to the northeastern end of the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as No. 27 Gerald Road from the houses and premises known as Nos. 76-82 inclusive Smyth Road and continuing thence south-westwards first to and then along the last-mentioned wall or fence and north-westwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Nos. 27 and 29 Gerald Road and continuing thence south-westwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Nos. 84 to 130 Smyth Road and in a straight line to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Francis, Ashton Gate, Bedminster, from the parish of Saint Aldhelm, Bedminster."

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, and with the consent of the Right Reverend Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the benefice of Saint Mary with Saint Simon, Sheffield, and the benefice of Saint Matthias, Sheffield, both situate in the diocese of Sheffield.

# "SCHEME

"1. *Union of benefices and parishes.*—The said benefice of Saint Mary with Saint Simon, Sheffield, and the said benefice of Saint Matthias, Sheffield, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Saint Mary with Saint Simon with Saint Matthias, Sheffield', and the parishes of the said benefices shall, subject to the further provisions of this Scheme, also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. *Taking effect of union.*—Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Samuel Henshaw if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Mary with Saint Simon, Sheffield, shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parish Church.*—The parish church of the parish of Saint Mary with Saint Simon, Sheffield, shall be the parish church of the united parish.

"4. *Registers.*—The marriage registers in duplicate current at the church of Saint Matthias, Sheffield, shall be dealt with in accordance with Section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949.

"5. *Parsonage Houses.*—The parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Saint Mary with Saint Simon, Sheffield, shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice, and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Saint Matthias, Sheffield, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, after the union has taken effect at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and accumulated by us, the said Church Commissioners, as a fund for the provision of a parsonage house for a benefice (either existing or proposed) in the diocese of Sheffield to be selected by the bishop of the said diocese.

"6. *Patronage.*—With the consents of the Reverend Canon William Leonard Bertram Caley, Mervyn Gurney Talbot-Rice, Esquire, John Foster Beaver, Esquire, the Reverend Sherard Falkner Allison and the Reverend Frederick Donald Coggan being the patrons of the benefice of Saint Matthias, Sheffield, and of the Very Reverend John Howard Cruse, incumbent of the Cathedral Benefice of Sheffield, as patron of the benefice of Saint Mary with Saint Simon, Sheffield (in testimony whereof the respective patrons have signed this Scheme), the patronage of the said benefice of Saint Matthias, Sheffield, shall be surrendered in favour of the said John Howard Cruse and to his successors incumbents of the Cathedral Benefice of Sheffield, and the patronage of the united benefice shall belong wholly to the incumbent for the time being of the said Cathedral Benefice of Sheffield.

"7. *Clerical and Lay Assistance.*—(a) Upon the union taking effect the incumbent of the united benefice shall, to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice, employ such clerical or such lay assistance as the Bishop of Sheffield shall from time to time direct.

"(b) There shall be appropriated as a fund towards the cost of providing such assistance as aforesaid a part of the endowments of the united benefice, that is to say, an annual sum of £100, being part of a larger sum at present payable by us, the said Church Commissioners, to the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Saint Matthias, Sheffield, and the said fund shall be paid by us to the diocesan board of finance of the said diocese as trustees to apply the same accordingly.

"8. *Diversion of Endowments.*—Upon the union taking effect the endowments specified in the Schedule hereto shall be severed or diverted from the said benefice of Saint Matthias, Sheffield, and from the united benefice and shall be transferred to and shall become vested in us, the said Church Commissioners, without any further conveyance or assurance to be held by us as part of and for the benefit of our General Fund subject to and with the benefit of any subsisting lease or leases and tenancy or tenancies and in consideration of the said transfer we shall make from time to time such grants as after consultation with the bishop of the said

diocese we may deem appropriate in augmentation or endowment of any benefice or benefices in the said diocese.

"9. *Taking down of Church.*—(a) As soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the church of Saint Matthias, Sheffield, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient.

"(b) The net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after payment of the expenses attendant thereon and upon the taking down of the church and all other expenses incidental to these matters shall be appropriated to the Expenses Fund of the said diocese established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"(c) The font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of Holy Communion in the said church of Saint Matthias, Sheffield, shall not be sold but shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the bishop of the diocese shall direct be transferred to some other church or churches within the said diocese and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said church of Saint Matthias, Sheffield, or such of them as the said bishop shall select, shall also be removed to some other church or chapel or churches or chapels within the said diocese as the bishop may direct or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said church of Saint Matthias, Sheffield, as aforesaid.

"10. *Alteration of boundaries.*—(a) With the consent (testified by his signing this Scheme) of the Reverend Thomas Mitchell Garaway as the incumbent of the benefice of Saint Augustine, Endcliffe, all that portion (shown by the pink colour on the map hereto) of the parish of Saint Matthias, Sheffield, which lies to the west of the middle of Pear Street and to the south of the middle of Ecclesall Road shall, upon the union taking effect, be severed from the remaining portion of the parish of Saint

Matthias, Sheffield, and united for ecclesiastical purposes with the parish of Saint Augustine, Endcliffe.

"(b) With the consent (testified by his signing this Scheme) of the Reverend James Haythornthwaite as incumbent of the benefice of Saint Silas, Gillcar, all that portion (shown by the brown colour on the said map) of the parish of Saint Matthias, Sheffield, which lies to the north of the middle of Ecclesall Road shall, upon the union taking effect, be severed from the remaining portion of the parish of Saint Matthias, Sheffield, and united for ecclesiastical purposes with the parish of Saint Silas, Gillcar.

"(c) With the consent (testified as aforesaid) of the Reverend Samuel Henshaw and with the consent (testified by his signing this Scheme) of the Reverend Donald Howes, as incumbent of the benefice of Heeley, all that portion (shown by the green colour on the said map) of the parish of Heeley which lies to the west of the middle of the main line of the British Railways (London Midland Region) and is contiguous to the parish of Saint Mary with Saint Simon, Sheffield, shall, upon the union taking effect, be severed from the remaining portion of the parish of Heeley and united for ecclesiastical purposes with the united parish of Saint Mary with Saint Simon with Saint Matthias, Sheffield.
