WHEREAS His Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts, 1937 and 1943, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the Twenty-seventh day of September, 1951, to delegate and grant unto Her Majesty The Queen, Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth Duchess of Edinburgh, Lady of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, C.I., Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, C.I., His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.M.B., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., and Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal, C.I., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., or any two of them, as Counsellors of State, full power and authority during the period of His Majesty's illness to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Supplementary Scheme bearing date the 29th day of June, 1951, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Supplementary Scheme for making certain alterations in the provisions of the Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 18th day of March, 1937, and published in the London Gazette on the 26th day of that month, for effecting ultimately the unions (1) of the benefice of Mautby with the benefice of Runham (then part of the united benefice of Runham with Thrigby) and (2) of the benefice of Filby with the benefice of Thrigby (then part of the said united benefice of Runham with Thrigby), all situate in the county of Norfolk and in the diocese of Norwich:

"SUPPLEMENTARY SCHEME.

"Whereas in accordance with the provisions of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council and in the events which have happened the said benefice of Thrigby will (but for the alterations of the said Order hereinafter recommended and proposed) be united with the said benefice of Filby upon the next avoidance of the said benefice of Filby:

"And whereas by Clause 7 of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council it was directed that upon the union of the said benefices of Filby and Thrigby taking effect a part of the total endowments of the

benefices comprised within the union should be severed or diverted from the said united benefice and be appropriated to the benefices of Griston and Hales with Heckingham, both in the said diocese of Norwich, in equal shares:

"And whereas the united benefice of Mautby with Runham and Thrigby (of which the said benefice of Thrigby is now, in accordance with certain interim provisions of the said Order, a part) is at present vacant:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, the said Church Commissioners, and it appears to us desirable (a) that the said benefices of Filby and Thrigby should forthwith be united, and (b) that Clause 7 of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council should be rescinded:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, with the consents of the Right Reverend Percy, Bishop of Norwich, of the Reverend Canon Harold Henry Peck, incumbent of the said benefice of Filby, of the Reverend Herbert Ernest King, incumbent of the said benefice of Griston, and of the Reverend Kenneth Owen Morris, incumbent of the said benefice of Hales with Heckingham (in witness whereof they have respectively signed this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council as follows, that is to say:—

"Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Supplementary Scheme is published in the London Gazette:—

"(1) the union of the said benefice of Filby and of the said benefice of Thrigby (now part of the united benefice of Mautby with Runham and Thrigby) shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Canon Harold Henry Peck shall, with his consent (testified as aforesaid), be the first incumbent of the united benefice;

"(2) the said Order of Your Majesty in Council shall be further altered by the rescission of the directions contained in Clause 7 thereof."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Supplementary Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Supplementary Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Letters Patent:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen and Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth, being authorized thereto by the said Letters Patent, have taken the said Supplementary Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf affirm the said Supplementary Scheme and order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.
