Chesterfield Rural District Council (Brimington No. 1) Extinguishment Order, 1951.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 15th day of October, 1951, the Minister of Local Government and Planning confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish the public right of way from Manor Road, Brimington Common (in the north-east corner of Brimington Common Recreation Ground) through the recreation ground in a westerly and south-westerly direction to the south-west corner of the ground.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at Rural Council House, Saltergate, Chesterfield, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and the hours of 2.15 p.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 15th day of October, 1951, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
