*The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas)  
Special Order No. 24, 1951.*

(Made 15th November, 1951.)

1. Declares an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles of Ganton, Scarborough, Yorkshire, to be an Infected Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938 are applied. The area subject to restrictions lies in the counties of East and North Riding of Yorkshire.

2. Declares an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles of Little Melton, Norwich, Norfolk and Somerleyton, Lowestoft, Suffolk, to be an Infected Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938 are applied. The area subject to restrictions lies in the counties of Norfolk and East Suffolk.

3. Extends the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around St. Osyth, Essex, declared by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 23, 1951, so as to include the County Borough of Ipswich and the parishes of Belstead, Wherstead and Freston, in the county of East Suffolk.

*The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas)  
Special Order No. 25, 1951.*

(Made 16th November, 1951.)

1. Declares an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles of Thurgarton, Nottingham, to be an Infected Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938 are applied. The area subject to restrictions lies in the counties of Leicester, Lincoln (Parts of Kesteven) and Nottingham.

2. Extends the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Little Melton, Norwich, Norfolk and Somerleyton, Lowestoft, Suffolk, declared by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 24, 1951, so as to include that part of the county of East Suffolk which lies within approximately 15 miles of Southwold.

*The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Controlled Areas)  
Special Order No. 3, 1951.*

This Order, which came into operation on 19th November, 1951, declares an area comprising the counties of East Sussex, Kent, Essex, East Suffolk, West Suffolk, Norfolk, Cambridge, Huntingdon, Isle of Ely, Soke of Peterborough, Lincoln (Parts of Holland), Lincoln (Parts of Kesteven), Lincoln (Parts of Lindsey), Nottingham and East Riding of Yorkshire, and part of the county of West Riding of Yorkshire to be a Controlled Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Controlled Areas Restrictions) General Order of 1938 are applied.

Special Order No. 26, 1951.*

(Made 17th November, 1951.)

1. Declares an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles of Sicklinghall, Wetherby, Yorkshire, to be an Infected Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938 are applied. The area subject to restrictions lies in the counties of East, North and West Ridings of Yorkshire.

2. Extends the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Winestead, Hull, declared by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 22, 1951, so as to include those parts of the counties of Lincoln (Parts of Lindsey) and East and West Ridings of Yorkshire which lie within approximately 15 miles of Melton, North Ferriby, Yorkshire.

3. Extends the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Little Melton, Norwich, and Somerleyton, Lowestoft, Suffolk, declared by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 24, 1951, and extended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 25, 1951, so as to include those parts of the counties of Norfolk and East Suffolk which lie within approximately 15 miles of Wortwell, Harleston, Norfolk.

4. Extends the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around St. Osyth, Essex, declared by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 23, 1951, and extended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 24, 1951, so as to include the parish of Sproughton, in the county of East Suffolk.
