HERNE BAY PIER.

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made on or before the twenty-third day of December next to the Minister of Transport by the Urban District Council of Herne Bay (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") for a Provisional Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of the General Pier and Harbour Act 1861 and the General Pier and Harbour Act 1861 Amendment Act for the following purposes or some of them (that is to say):—

1. To repeal the unrepealed provisions of the Herne Bay Pier Order 1896 and the Herne Bay Pier Order 1909.
2. To provide for the undertaking carried on by the Council at and in connection with the pier continuing to be vested in the Council.
3. To authorise the Council to purchase by agreement and hold and to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of lands.
4. To define in reference to the pier the limits within which the Council shall have authority and the rates which may be levied by the Council.
5. To empower the Council to maintain and improve the pier.
6. To empower the Council to erect pavilions and other buildings.
7. To authorise the Council to dredge.
8. To empower the Council to levy rates and charges to prescribe such rates and charges and

to confer vary or extinguish exemptions from payment thereof, to compound with respect thereto and to make provision for the revision of such rates and charges.

9. To empower the Council to charge higher rates at certain times and to close the pier on special occasions.

10. To enable the Council to sell or lease their pier undertaking or any part thereof or the right to collect and retain rates and charges.

11. To authorise the Council to borrow money and to enact other financial matters.

12. To enact provisions with regard to byelaws and the holding of inquiries by the Minister of Transport.

13. To enact provisions with regard to life-saving apparatus and sunk stranded or abandoned vessels.

14. To provide that the Council shall be a local lighthouse authority and that they shall have the appointment of meters and weighers.

15. To enact all other necessary or consequential provisions.

And notice is hereby also given that, on or before the 30th day of November instant, a copy of this notice will be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Kent County Council at his office in the County Hall, Maidstone; at the Customs House for the Port of Dover, 1 Cambridge Terrace, Dover, and at the office of the Ministry of Transport, Berkeley Square House, London, W.1.

On and after the 23rd day of December next printed copies of the draft Provisional Order will be furnished at the price of one shilling each to all persons applying for the same at the offices of the undermentioned Clerk and Parliamentary Agents.

Any objections to the Order which it is intended to urge on the Minister of Transport must be received by him on or before the 15th day of January next. A copy of such objections must also be sent at the same time to the undermentioned Clerk or Parliamentary Agents and in forwarding the objections to the Ministry of Transport the objectors or their agents should state that this has been done.
