UCKFIELD RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Uckfield Rural District Council (Buxted Footpath No. 12) Diversion Order, 1951.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 29th day of October, 1951, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Local Government and Planning for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the parish of Buxted, Sussex.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way running from the entrance to Mascalls Farm, Buxted, through Ordnance Survey Parcel No. 1555 to the south east boundary of O.P. No. 1561 to a line running from the gate in the north east corner of O.P. No. 1561 along the south east boundary of the said field to connect with the right of way running in a south westerly direction.

SAMFORD RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

The Samford Rural District Council (East Bergholt Path No. 1 (Revised)) Diversion Order, 1951.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 18th day of October, 1951, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the following parish:—

East Bergholt.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way which crosses Fields Nos. 286 and 580 (Ordnance Survey 1903 Edition) on the west side of Flatford Lane. The existing footpath runs from the centre of the northern boundary of field No. 286 across the field to a point near the south-west corner of the field, where it crosses the stream and runs across field No. 580 in a westerly direction. The diverted footpath will run along the northern boundary of field No. 286 for its whole length to the north-west corner of the field where it reaches the stream (over which a footbridge will be constructed); it will then run across field No. 580 in a south-westerly direction.

DURSLEY RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Dursley Rural District Council (Mawdsley's Path) Diversion Order, 1951.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 15th day of November, 1951, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert that part of the public right of way running from Uley Road in a south-westerly direction through Ordnance Survey Enclosures Numbers 117 and 116 to a point approximately 12 feet East or North-east of Caswell Stream to a line commencing in Uley Road aforesaid at a point approximately one hundred and sixty feet in an easterly direction from the Uley Road terminus of the existing public right of way and running first in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately two hundred and thirty feet through Ordnance Survey Enclosure Number 117 thence in a south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately six hundred and ninety feet where it will join with the existing path at the said point approximately twelve feet East or North-east of Caswell Stream.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, Kingshill, Dursley, Gloucestershire, and will be open for inspection, free of charge, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday, and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturday, in each week.

The Order becomes operative as from the 1st day of December, 1951, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.
