BOROUGH OF BASINGSTOKE.

*The Borough of Basingstoke (Downland Estate  
Footpath) Diversion Order, 1951.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 4th day of October 1951 the Minister of Local Government and Planning confirmed the above order.

The effect of the order is to divert the public right of way over a strip of land of irregular width but at least 6 feet wide in its narrowest parts running in a direct line across the Downland Estate Basingstoke aforesaid from a point on the Eastern boundary of the said estate in a North-Westerly direction towards Worthing Road Basingstoke aforesaid for a distance of approximately 300 feet and terminating on the Western boundary of the said estate to a strip of land part of the Downland Estate aforesaid at least 6 feet wide running in a Westerly direction for a distance of approximately 82 feet from the South-Eastern end of the strip of land over which ran the public right of way diverted by the said order then proceeding for a distance of approximately 80 feet in a North-Westerly direction to a point where it turns Westwards for a distance of approximately 79 feet and then proceeds Northwards for a distance of approximately 148 feet until it meets the North-Western end of the strip of land over which ran the public right of way diverted by the said order.

A certified copy of the order and of the map contained in the order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Town Clerk's Office, Municipal Buildings, Basingstoke, and will be open for inspection free of charge during the usual office hours.

The order became operative as from the said 4th day of October, 1951, but if any person aggrieved by the order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

(Tackley) Diversion Order, 1951.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the above order was made on the 13th day of November, 1951, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Town and Country Planning for confirmation.

The order relates to land situate in the parish of Tackley.

The effect of the order will be to create a public right of way on foot from the point marked "C" to the point marked "D" on the map hereinafter referred to, i.e., from a point west of the Methodist Chapel in the parish of Tackley across the garden ground of the cottage known as Kifissia Cottage in the parish of Tackley to the footpath on which certain council houses abut and to extinguish the public right of way from the point marked "A" to the point marked "B" on the said map, i.e., from a point west of the Methodist Chapel in the parish of Tackley across the garden ground of the cottage mentioned above to the footpath on which certain council houses abut.

(SCOTLAND) ACT 1936.
