WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 9th day of November, 1951, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the *New Parishes Measure, 1943*, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parish of *Abington*, the parish of *Weston Favell*, and the parish of *Saint Matthew, Northampton*, all in the diocese of *Peterborough*, and for constituting part of the parish of *Abington* and part of the parish of *Weston Favell* a new parish.

“ SCHEME.

“ Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied (1) that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parish of *Abington*, the parish of *Weston Favell* and the parish of *St. Matthew, Northampton*, should be altered in the manner described in *Parts I and II* of the subjoined Schedule, and as delineated on the map hereto annexed, and (2) that the spiritual interests of the area defined in *Part III* of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map would be best served by constituting it a new parish and that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

“ And whereas there is within the area described in *Part III* of the said Schedule a consecrated church known as the church of *Saint Alban the Martyr, Abington*, which has been approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and of which the patronage belongs to the *Bishop of Peterborough* by virtue of an agreement in writing dated the 3rd day of *August, 1951*, and made pursuant to section 9 of the *New Parishes Measure, 1943*.

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the *Right Reverend Spencer, Bishop of Peterborough*, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. As from the day of the date of the publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme (a) the boundaries of the said parish of *Abington*, the said parish of *Weston Favell*, and the said parish of *Saint Matthew, Northampton*, shall be altered in the manner described in *Parts I and II* of the said Schedule and delineated on the map annexed hereto, and (b) the area defined in *Part III* of the said Schedule, and delineated on the said map shall be a new parish.

“ 2. The church of *Saint Alban the Martyr, Abington*, aforesaid, shall be the parish church of the parish.

“ 3. The name of the parish shall be ‘the parish of *Saint Alban the Martyr, Abington*.’

“ 4. The parish shall be in the *Archdeaconry of Northampton* and in the *rural deanery of Haddon* (second deanery).

“ THE SCHEDULE.

“ PART I.

“ The territory (coloured green on the map) to be annexed to the parish of *Saint Matthew, Northampton*:—

“ All that portion of the parish of *Abington* which is bounded upon the northwest by the parish of *Saint Matthew, Northampton*, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of *Birchfield Road* on the boundary which divides the parish of *Saint Matthew, Northampton*, from the parish of *Abington* and extending thence northeastwards along the middle of *Birchfield Road* to a point opposite to the middle of the southern end of *Park Avenue North* and continuing thence northwards to and along *Park Avenue North* to the boundary which divides the parish of *Abington* from the parish of *Saint Matthew, Northampton*.

“ PART II.

“ The territory (coloured blue on the map) to be annexed to the parish of *Weston Favell*:—

“ All that portion of the parish of *Abington* which is bounded upon the northeast and southeast by the parish of *Weston Favell* and upon the remaining side by an imaginary line commencing at the southeastern end of the wall or fence which divides the houses and premises numbered 168 and 166 *The Headlands* on the boundary which divides the parish of *Weston Favell* from the parish of *Abington* and extending thence southwards along the walls or fences of the houses and premises numbered 166 to 144 *The Headlands* to the boundary which divides the last mentioned parishes.

“ PART III.

“ The territory (coloured pink on the map) comprising:—

“ All those contiguous portions of the parishes of *Abington* and *Weston Favell* which, taken together, are bounded upon part of the west by the territory described in *Part I* of this Schedule and proposed to be annexed to the parish of *Saint Matthew, Northampton*, upon the remaining part of the west by the last mentioned parish, and by the parish of *Holy Trinity, Northampton*, upon the northwest by the parish of *Kingsthorpe*, upon the north by the extra parochial place known as *Moulton Park* and the parish of *Weston Favell* and upon the northeast partly by the last mentioned parish, and partly by the territory described in *Part II* of this Schedule and proposed to be annexed to the parish of *Weston Favell* and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at the eastern end of the wall or fence which divides the houses and premises numbered 144 and 142 *The Headlands* and continuing

thence southwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises numbered 142 to 78 The Headlands to Birchfield Road East and continuing thence in the same direction to the middle of the last mentioned road and then southwestwards along the middle of the said road to a point opposite to the middle of the southern end of Park Avenue North where it meets the southern and eastern boundaries of the territory described in Part I of this Schedule."

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Guy Vernon, Bishop of Leicester (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Constitution.*

"(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes until the consecration of the church of Saint Christopher therein situated.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of the said church the area shall become a new parish.

"All those contiguous portions of the parishes of St. Thomas the Apostle, Glen Parva and South Wigston; Aylestone; St. James, Aylestone Park; and St. Mary Magdalen, Knighton; which taken together are bounded upon part of the east by the parish of Great Wigston and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of the British Railways (Midland Region) at Wigston Junction North (opposite to the eastern end of the wall or fence which divides closes numbered 10 and 8A) on the boundary which divides the parish of Great Wigston from the parish of St. Thomas the Apostle, Glen Parva and South Wigston, and extending thence westwards to and along the walls or fences which divide closes numbered 10 and 9 from close number 8A to the wall or fence which divides closes numbered 9 and 8A from close number 8 and continuing thence westwards to the eastern end of the southern boundary of the parish of Aylestone and continuing thence generally in the same direction along the last mentioned boundary to the bridle road opposite to the south western corner of Catherine Spinney and continuing thence northwards (west of Catherine Spinney and Two Acre Spinney) along the western side of the said bridle road to the south east end of the wall or fence which divides close number 258 from close number 262 and continuing thence generally northwards, north westwards and north eastwards along the walls or fences which divide closes numbered 258, 259, 244A, 244, 243 and 1324, from closes numbered 262, 261, 260, 242, 241, 1325, and 1291 and continuing thence in the same direction for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to

the middle of Wigston Lane and continuing thence south eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane to a point opposite to the south western end of the walls or fences of the north western walls or fences of the houses and premises on the north western side of Aylestone Drive and continuing thence north eastwards to and along the last mentioned walls or fences to their north eastern end and continuing thence in the same direction to a point 40 yards or thereabouts north westwards from the middle of the south western end of Milligan Road on the boundary which divides the parish of Aylestone from the parish of St. James, Aylestone Park, and continuing thence north eastwards in a line parallel to Milligan Road for a distance of 280 yards or thereabouts and continuing thence in a straight line first south eastwards to and then north eastwards along the middle of Milligan Road to a point opposite to the middle of St. Andrews Road and continuing thence south eastwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned road to the middle of Saffron Lane and continuing thence north eastwards to and along the wall or fence dividing the house and premises Number 450 Saffron Lane from the house and premises Number 2 The Fairway and continuing eastwards and northwards along the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises numbered 2, 4, 6 and 8 The Fairway to a point at the north western end of the wall or fence which divides the house and premises number 89 Bloomfield Road from the house and premises number 8 The Fairway and continuing thence south eastwards along the wall or fence which divides the houses and premises numbered 8, 10, 12 and 14 The Fairway from the houses and premises numbered 89, 91, 93 and 95 Bloomfield Road and thence in a southerly direction to a point in the middle of The Fairway opposite to the middle of the southern end of Bloomfield Road and thence first north eastwards to and along the wall or fence which divides the houses and premises numbered 94 and 96 Bloomfield Road from the houses and premises numbered 16 and 18 The Fairway; and continuing thence south eastwards along the walls or fences which divide the houses and premises numbered 20 and 22 The Fairway from the house and premises number 92 Bloomfield Road to the south western wall or fence of close number 1207 and continuing thence south eastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the south western wall or fence of close number 1206 to the north western corner of the wall or fence of the house and premises numbered 82 The Fairway and continuing thence south eastwards along the wall or fence forming the north eastern boundary of the houses and premises numbered 82 to 112 (inclusive) The Fairway and continuing thence north eastwards along the north western boundary walls or fences of the houses and premises numbered 2 to 14 Boulder Lane and continuing thence south eastwards along the north eastern walls or fences of the houses and premises numbered 14 and 16 Boulder Lane and continuing thence in the same direction along the wall or fence at the northern end of Windley Road and continuing thence in a south easterly direction along the wall or fence forming the north eastern boundary of the houses and premises numbered 42 to 50 Windley Road and the houses and premises numbered 8 to 20 (inclusive) Burnside Road (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the parish of St. James, Aylestone Park from the parish of St. Mary Magdalen, Knighton) and continuing thence along the walls or fences forming the north eastern boundary of the houses and premises numbered 22 to 38 (inclusive) Burnside Road and continuing thence in a straight line in the same direction to the middle of the Main Line of the British Railways (Midland Region) and continuing thence southwards along the middle of the said railway to the point where the boundaries which divide the parishes of St. Mary Magdalen, Knighton, Great Wigston and St. Thomas the Apostle, Glen Parva and South Wigston, all meet."

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Salisbury, (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Edington and the benefice of Imber both situate in the diocese of Salisbury.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices and Parishes.* The said benefice of Edington and the said benefice of Imber shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Edington and Imber' and the parishes of the said benefices shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* With the consent, (certified by his signature hereto), of the Reverend William Bernard Charles, being the present incumbent of the benefice of Edington, the union shall take effect (a) if the benefice of Imber is vacant upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette upon that day, or (b) if the benefice of Imber is not vacant upon that day, upon the next avoidance of that benefice; and in either event the Reverend William Bernard Charles, if he is then the incumbent of the benefice of Edington, shall be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parish Church.* The Parish Church of the parish of Edington shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish.

"4. *Registers.* The marriage registers current at the Church of Imber shall be dealt with in accordance with Section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books (if any) of baptisms and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said Church shall be transferred to the Parish Church of Edington.

"5. *Parsonage House.* The parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Edington shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice, and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Imber and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale shall be held by us as part of the endowments of the united benefice.

"6. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.* The united benefice shall be in the Archdeaconry of Wilts and in the rural deanery of Devizes."

WHEREAS the Minister of Local Government and Planning, after giving 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, did under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, 16 & 17 Vict. c. 134, as amended by subsequent enactments, make a Representation to His Majesty in Council that for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Lilleshall in the County of Salop, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Local Government and Planning, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 4th October, 1951, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 26th day of November next, and such Order has been published in the London

Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 1st November, 1951, S.I. 1951 No. 1900, the style and title of the Minister of Local Government and Planning was changed to “The Minister of Housing and Local Government.”

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. No new burial ground shall be opened in the said Parish of Lilleshall save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, and burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

Lilleshall.—Forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard of the Parish Church of Lilleshall in the said Parish.

Provided that—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Lilleshall) Order, 1951.

1. Age.

Candidates must be under 30 years of age on the 1st March, 1952; provided that the Commissioners may at their discretion admit to this competition a candidate aged 30 or over on that date if

(a) the candidate has since the 1st July, 1950, been recalled from the Reserve for a period of service or training with H.M. Forces, and such period ended on or after his 27th birthday;

(b) during the period of such service or training he missed one or more Limited Competitions among members of the Minor and Manipulative grades for the Clerical Classes and Branch B (Grade 6) of the Foreign Service for which he was in all respects eligible at the time; and

(c) he has applied to compete in the second and every subsequent Limited Competition among members of the Minor and Manipulative grades for the Clerical Classes and Branch B (Grade 6) of the Foreign Service for which he was eligible and for which the closing date for applications fell after his return from service or training with H.M. 2. Grades eligible.

No departure from this rule will be made without the special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and then only in exceptional cases, and in favour of candidates who satisfy the conditions laid down above for the Home Civil Service.

6. Health and Character.
