"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Supplementary Scheme for making certain alterations in the provisions of an Order of Your Majesty in Council (hereinafter called 'the original Order') dated the 7th day of August, 1940, and published in the London Gazette on the 9th day of the same month for effecting the unions (1) of the benefice of Spennymoor, Saint Paul, with a part of the benefice of Whitworth and (2) of the benefice of Byers Green with the remaining part of the said benefice of Whitworth, all situate in the diocese of Durham.

"Supplementary Scheme.

"Whereas the unions of the said benefices have taken effect:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, the Church Commissioners, and we are satisfied that certain provisions contained in the original Order should be altered as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"Now, therefore, we the said Church Commissioners, with the consents of the Right Reverend Alwyn, Bishop of Durham, and of the Reverend Gordon Robertson Berriman, now incumbent of the benefice of Whitworth with Spennymoor, and of the Benefice of Arthur Leonard Passen now incumbent of Reverend Arthur Leonard Russen now incumbent of the benefice of Byers Green, (in testimony whereof they have signed this Scheme), do humbly recom-mend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that

That clause 5 of the said Order (which clause directs, inter alia, the sale of the parsonage house belonging to the said benefice of Whitworth and the application of the net proceeds of the sale) shall be altered by directing that (1) out of the said proceeds the sum of £2,400 shall be paid by us to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the diocese of Durham as trustees to hold and invest the same as capital in two equal moieties and to apply the interest or dividends in respect of each such moiety towards the repair of the parish churches of the parishes of Whitworth and Byers Green respectively and (2) the balance of the said proceeds shall without any condition as to use except as provided in the said Measures or any Measure in amendment thereof constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund constituted pursuant to Section 32 of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923. That the provisions of clause 6 of the said Order (which clause directs, in effect and inter alia, the application of certain endowments as an endowment fund for an assistant curacy within each of the said united benefices of Byers Green and Whitworth with Spennymoor and the payment by us of an annual payment of £120 in or towards the stipend of the curate holding the said assistant curacy in Byers Green) shall be extended by directing that the income of the said curacy endowment funds and the said annual payment may in the event of the services of an assistant curate not being available within the affected united benefice be applied in or towards the remuneration of such whole or part time clerical or lay assistant or assistants as the Bishop of the diocese may from time to time require to be employed within that united benefice."
