THE above named Council, having applied to the Minister of Health, under Section 14 of the Food and Drugs Act, 1938, for an order declaring the said Section 14 to be in force in the Urban District of Royton, notice is hereby given that the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the said Section 14, has by S.I. 1951 No. 2046, made the 26th November, 1951, ordered as follows:—

1. This order may be cited as the Royton Urban District (Food) Order, 1951, and shall come into operation on the 17th day of December, 1951.

2. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3.—(1) Section 14 (which requires the registration of premises used in connection with the manufacture or sale of ice cream or preserved food, etc.) of the Food and Drugs Act, 1938, is hereby declared to be in force in the urban district.

(2) Section 116 (Registration in county districts of premises used in connection with sale of ice cream or preserved food) of the Lancashire County Council (Rivers Board and General Powers) Act, 1938, is hereby specified as a provision which shall be repealed as respects the urban district, by sub-section (9) of the said section 14.
