

The Order relates to land situate in the urban district of Waltham Holy Cross.

The effect of the Order will be to divert public rights of way running criss-cross over a field laying to the west of Galley Hill Road (Opposite Dallance Farm) (Ordnance Sheet Essex Plot 411 and 451 (part)) to a line running from a point in Galley Hill Road immediately south of Plot 413, westwards along the northern boundary of Plot No. 450 and thence southwards for a distance of one hundred yards and westwards along the northern boundary of Plot 451, thence north-westwards along boundary of Plot 450 and eastern boundary of Plots 409 and 237, thence in a westerly direction to Clappgate Lane, and in an easterly direction on the north side of the hedge bounding Plot 411, to rejoin Galley Hill Road at a point immediately north of Plot 412 as shown on the map attached to the Order.
