# RECRUITMENT TO THE SITUATION OF OFFICER OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE<sup>5</sup> (MALE).

1. No candidate may compete more than twice in all under Normal Regulations and under Reconstruc-tion Regulations for the situation of Officer of Customs and Excise.
