The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 24th day of January, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Acts, 1836 to 1840, and of the Archdeaonries and Rural Deaneries Act, 1874, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme with respect to four of the rural deaneries within the archdeaonries of Oxford and Berkshire in the diocese of Oxford.

"Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Kenneth, Bishop of Oxford, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to four of the rural deaneries within the said archdeaonries are desirable and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, first the parish of Stanton Harcourt in the rural deanery of Woodstock, in the said Archdeaconry of Oxford, shall be transferred to the rural deanery of Witney in the same Archdeaconry; and secondly, the parishes of Stratfield Mortimer and Mortimer West End in the rural deanery of Reading in the said Archdeaconry of Berkshire shall be transferred to the rural deanery of Bradfield, in the same Archdeaconry; and each of the said parishes shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the rural dean of the rural deanery to which it is hereby transferred and shall not belong to or be a part of any other rural deanery nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other rural dean."

And whereas the provisions of the said Acts relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of Amersham, Chalfont Saint Giles, and Chenies, all in the diocese of Oxford.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Kenneth, Bishop of Oxford, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Amersham, Chalfont Saint Giles and Chenies shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Amersham:—

"All those contiguous parts of the parishes of Chalfont Saint Giles and Chenies (together coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which, taken together, are bounded upon the north by the parish of Chenies, upon the west by the parish of Amersham and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Amersham from the parish of Chalfont Saint Giles in the middle of Burton's Lane, and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of Burton's Lane to a point opposite the middle of the north-eastern end of Burton's Way, and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of Burton's Way to a point opposite the northwestern end of the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as 'Bidston', Burton's Lane, and continuing thence generally southeastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as 'Beardown to Raglan', Burton's Lane and continuing thence northeastwards along the wall or fence which divides the last mentioned house and premises from the house and premises known as 'Argosy', Burton's Lane

and in the same straight line to a point in the middle of Burton's Lane and continuing thence northwestwards along the middle of Burton's Lane to a point opposite the southwestern end of the wall or fence on the southeastern side of the house and premises known as 'Long Gabreys', Burton's Lane and continuing thence northeastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises on the southeastern side of Loudham's Wood Lane and in the same straight line to the boundary which divides the parish of Chalfont Saint Giles from the parish of Chenies and continuing thence northwestwards along the said boundary to a point on the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as 'Glenfield', Village Way, and continuing thence northeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence, along the wall or fence which divides the vacant plot which lies to the northeast of the last mentioned house and premises from Close numbered 199 on the map annexed hereto, along the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as 'Thatches', Village Way, and along the wall or fence which divides the vacant plot which lies to the northeast of the last mentioned house and premises from Close numbered 199 and continuing thence first northeastwards and then northwestwards along the wall or fence which divides Close numbered 199 from Close numbered 200 on the map annexed hereto and along the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as 'The Brackens', Village Way and in the same straight line to the boundary which divides the parish of Chenies from the parish of Chalfont Saint Giles, thereby crossing the Metropolitan Railway Line of the London Transport Executive and Close numbered 183."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of September, 1951, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for authorising the taking down and the sale of the site and materials of the Church of Dowles in the parish of Bewdley with Dowles, in the diocese of Worcester.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas the said Church of Dowles is a chapel of ease to the parish church of the said parish of Bewdley with Dowles.

"And whereas the said Church of Dowles has ceased to be used for the purposes of Divine Service.

"Now, therefore we, the said Church Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Worcester (testified by his signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That upon the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the marriage registers current at the said Church of Dowles shall be dealt with in accordance with Section 62 of the Marriage

Act, 1949, and the register books (if any) of baptisms and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said church shall be transferred to the parish church of the parish of Bewdley with Dowles.

"2. That so soon as conveniently may be after the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the Church of Dowles shall be taken down and the materials and the site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto, and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof, shall be sold or disposed of by us the said Church Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

"3. That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after payment of the expenses attendant thereon and upon the taking down of the said church shall be appropriated to the Diocesan Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Worcester established pursuant to the said Measures.

"4. That the furniture and fittings of the said Church of Dowles of such of them as the Bishop shall select shall be removed to some other church or chapel or churches or chapels within the said Diocese of Worcester as the Bishop may direct, or shall (with the exception of the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of Holy Communion) be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Dowles."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

A Notice of Dissolution of Partnership not signed by all the Partners, or their legal representatives, must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court to the effect that such notice is given in pursuance of the terms of the partnership to which it relates.

Advertisements purporting to be issued in pursuance of Statutes or under Orders of Court will not be inserted unless signed or attested by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.
